551. DULAFID: Ahmad b. 'Abd al-'Aziz, 879-893, AV dinar (4.07g), Hamadan, AH274, A-1397, citing the caliph al-Mu'tamid, the heir al-Muwaffaq and the latter son Ahmad b. al-Muwaffaq, slightly crinkled, VF, R \$650 - 750



BANIJURID: al-Harith b. Harb, 10th century, AR multiple 552. dirham (11.92g), unclear mint name, perhaps intended for Kurat Badakhshan, ND, A-1439, SNAT-XIVc:336, AU \$80 - 100



SAMANID: Ahmad II, 907-914, AR dirham (4.94g), Banjhir, 553. AH299, A-1446, very rare mint for the Samanids, minor \$230 - 280 discoloration, attractive VF-EF, RR



554. SAMANID: Ahmad II, 907-914, AR dirham (2.72g), Ma'dan, AH300, A-1446var, with Qur'an Surat 112 instead of the normal Samanid reverse field legend, porous surfaces, \$320 - 380 F-VF, RRR

Struck by unknown authorities during the chaotic final years of the reign of Ahmad II.



555. SAMANID: Nasr II, 914-943, AV dinar (4.26g), Nishapur, AH323, A-1449, caliph al-Radi, citing the engraver Bu Harith in the obverse margin, at 9:00, superb strike, perfectly centered, choice EF-AU





556. SAMANID: Nasr II, 914-943, AV dinar (4.41g), Nishapur, AH324, A-1449, citing the engraver Bu Harith in the obverse margin, ornate symbol above obverse field, choice EF \$320 - 380



SAMANID: Nasr II, 914-943, AV dinar (4.02g), Samarqand, 557. AH325, A-1449, VF-EF \$420 - 480



558. SAMANID: Nasr II, 914-943, AV dinar (3.77g), al-Muhammadiya, AH329, A-1449, nasr min Allah in minuscule letters above obverse field, wa fath qarib below reverse field ("help is from God, victory is near"), usual weakness for this \$320 - 380 mint, VF, R



SAMANID: Nasr II, 914-943, AV dinar (4.19g), Nishapur, 559 AH331, A-1449, caliph al-Muttaqi, citing the engraver Bu Harith in the obverse margin at 1h, nice strike, choice EF \$300 - 350



- 560. VOLGA BULGAR: Anonymous, ca. 913-922, AR dirham (2.72g), A-Q1481, citing the Samanid Nasr b. Ahmad (AH301-331) on the reverse, but imitating mint & date al-Shash 294 on the obverse, EF, RR \$320 - 380
 - A relatively early version of the Volga Bulgar types, possibly struck by order of contemporary East European traders.

573. SELJUQ OF HAMADAN: Shams al-Ma'ali Chaghri Takin, 1074-1085, AV dinar (2.25g), Hamadan, AHxx6, A-A1707, citing the caliph al-Muqtadi, and the Great Seljuq Malikshah, so probably dated AH476, off-center strike, VF, R \$230 - 280 Seal of Sulayman twice in the reverse field.



574. **KHWARIZMSHAH: Mangubarni**, 1220-1231, AR double dirham (5.93g), Qal'a Nay, ND, A-1743, citing the caliph al-Nasir (1180-1225), superb specimen, the nicest example we have seen, bold VF, **RRR** \$500 - 600 Qal'a Nay was a fortress located to the west of Ghazna, active as a mint only during the short reign of Mangubarni.

577. ARTUQIDS OF AMID & KAYFA: Fakhr al-Din Qara Arslan, 1144-1174, AE dirham (6.43g), NM, AH56(2), A-1820.7, SS-7, long-haired male bust facing, some corrosion, nice portrait, VF

580. **ARTUQIDS OF MARDIN: II-Ghazi II**, 1176-1184, AE dirham (14.71g), AH579, A-1828.2, SS-32, large & small draped busts facing, VF \$120 - 150

The bottom three lines of the reverse text are hadha al-dirham ma'lun man yu'ayyaruhu, *"cursed is he who abuses this dirham",* one of the earliest Islamic coins that bears a forewarning to anyone contemplating forgery.

583. ARTUQIDS OF MARDIN: Artuq Arslan, 1201-1239, AR dirham (2.91g), Dunaysir, AH625, A-1831.2, citing the Rumseljuq ruler Kayqubad I as overlord & the caliph al-Mustansir, EF \$140 - 180

587. ZANGIDS OF AL-MAWSIL: Mawdud, 1149-1169, AE dirham (11.91g), NM, AH555, A-1858, SS-59, facing bust, slightly to the left, with two angels above, without overlord, superb strike, choice VF \$160 - 200



 588. ZANGIDS OF AL-MAWSIL: Mahmud, 1219-1233, AV dinar (4.52g), al-Mawsil, AH622, A-1869, citing the Ayyubid overlords al-Kamil Muhammad and al-Ashraf Musa, with the caliph al-Nasir (AH575-622), EF \$250 - 300



- 589. LU'LU'IDS: Badr al-Din Lu'lu', 1233-1258, AV dinar (5.75g), "al-Mawsil", blundered date, A-1871, contemporary imitation, with many spelling errors in both the religious and administrative texts, VF-EF \$470 - 550
 - It seems likely that these imitations were made either in the Christian communities or in the regions brought under Mongol domination.



590. BEGTIMURID: Sayf al-Din Begtimur, 1183-1193, AE fals (6.11g), NM, AH(5)82, A-1889, mare over suckling foal, very clear date, small area of weakness, F-VF \$140 - 180



591. **MENKUJAKID of Divrigi: Sayf al-Din Shahinshah**, 1177-1178, AE dirham (6.46g), NM, ND, A-1893, inscriptions only, citing the Rum Seljuq Qilij Arslan II as overlord, decent strike for this coarsely struck type, VF, **RRR** \$180 - 220

KHAQANID: Abu'l-Hasan Muhammad b. Ahmad, 981-991, 592 AR donative dirham (2.86g), Bardha'a, AH373, A-1907Z, helmeted horseman left, 3 lines text, abu'l-hayja / 'ali khalifat Allah / muhammad bin al-sallâr / kalima in center, mint & date around, pierced, never cleaned, VF-EF, RRRR \$3,600 - 4,200 This is only known donative of the Khaqanids, also known as the Shirvanshahs, 2nd period. This is the third known specimen and probably the only one in private hands, and it was published by Akopyan & Vardanyan (reference not available to us). The first several rulers of the Shirvanshahs, until AH455, are also known as the Mazyadids. Careful conservation could significantly improve the appearance of this important coin. ASSASSINS AT ALAMUT (BATINID): Muhammad III, 593. 1221-1254, AR dirham (3.40g), MM, AH619, A-1921, struck at Maymana, but mint off flan due to some weakness and \$800 - 1,000 off-centering of strike, attractive VF, RRR This type bears purely Sunni inscriptions, and the royal inscriptions resemble those of the Khwarizmshah ruler Muhammad. 594. SALGHURID: Abish bint Sa'd, 1265-1285, AR dirham (2.62g), NM, AH(6)65, A-1930, with the Chinese character bao in the obverse center, about 25% flat strike, VF, RR \$470 - 550 595. SALGHURID: Abish bint Sa'd, 1265-1285, AR dirham (2.80g), NM, AH(6)65, A-1930, with the Chinese character bao in the obverse center, minor weakness (as normal for this type), lightly cleaned, VF, RR \$470 - 550 QUTLUGHKHANID: Suyurghatmish, 1282-1294, 596 AV dinar (5.69g) (Kirman), AH684, A-B1936, Zeno-19195 (this piece), citing the Ilkhan ruler Arghun as overlord, boldly clear date, VF, RR \$580 - 680

From the circa 1996 hoard, as are virtually all known dinars of Ghazna 618. The hoard allegedly contained between 150 and 200 examples, all from the same pair of dies.

GREAT MONGOLS: Chingiz Khan, 1206-1227, posthumous issue, AV dinar (6.12g), Dihistan, AH(6)41, A-1966, *al-qa'an al-'adil al-a'zam* in obverse field, with the mint repeated below, and the mint & date in the obverse margin, as (*d*)*ihista(n sana i)hda arba'i(n)*, very clear and engraved in Fine calligraphy, off-center strike, VF, RRR
Standard to the piece on the appianed to the reign of

Because of the date, this piece can be assigned to the reign of Queen Töregene, AH639-644.

 - The obverse is inscribed bi-farman / al-khaqan al-a'zam / chingiz khan / al-'adil, with the mint & date around, kalima & the four Rashidun on the reverse. Always very weakly struck, normally without legible mint & date.



602. GREAT MONGOLS: Chingiz Khan, 1206-1227, AE broad khani dirham (6.44g), Samarqand, AH62x, A-1968E, Zeno-107882 (this piece), inscribed khani / chingiz khan / al-'adil / al-a'zam, fully clear on this piece, bent across the center, otherwise very attractive, unique, VF, RRRR \$1,000 - 1,200 According to the eminent scholar Pavel Petrov, "This is a unique coin (new type) with name (title) of Chingiz Khan. The mint name is not clear, but probably is read as bi samar[qand]. The type doesn't fit to known coins of 618-619; I'd suggest that this coin was struck in 621-622."



603. GREAT MONGOLS: Chingiz Khan, 1206-1227, AR broad khani dirham (5.04g), Balkh, AH[6]18, A-1968, obverse in circle-in-square, reverse in ornamental lobated square, full date, sufficiently clear mint name, without the denomination term khani, VF, RRR \$230 - 280

GREAT MONGOLS: Chingiz Khan, 1206-1227, AE broad dirham (3.07g), Samarqand, AH622, A-1968F, Dav—, tamgha of Chingiz Khan and double-knot in reverse center, the double-knot (instead of the mint name *samarqand*) repeated in obverse center, the first reported specimen of this variety, and possibly unique, Fine, RRRR \$650 750
 - With the Persian phrase be-samarqand o navahi-yi u in sekkeh ruyan, "current in Samarqand and the environs of this city". Date in words, once on obverse, twice on reverse.



- 605. **GREAT MONGOLS: Chingiz Khan**, 1206-1227, AE broad khani dirham (4.75g), [Marghinan], ND, A-1968M, without mint and date, citing only the caliph al-Nasir on obverse, the kalima on reverse, arranged as on the Qarakhanid dirham of Marghinan 602, unpublished and perhaps unique, F-VF, **RRRR** \$650 - 750
 - This piece is of identical design and arrangment to A-3424, but is totally anonymous except for the name of the caliph al-Nasir. It was likely struck during the lifetime of Chingiz Khan, to judge by style and calligraphy.



606. **GREAT MONGOLS: Chingiz Khan**, 1206-1227, AE jital (4.08g), [Ghazna], ND, A-1969, Chingiz cited as *'adl-i khaqan al-a'zam*, superb strike, perfectly centered, choice VF \$120 - 150

Reverse legend "David king, son of George the Baghratid," and "struck at Tiflis" at the lower right.



617. GREAT MONGOLS: Möngke, 1251-1260, AR dirham (2.65g), Tiflis, AH656, A-1977, Bennett-262m (same obverse die), month of Dhu'l-Hijja, seal of Solomon on obverse, tampha of Möngke on reverse, bold strike with full month and date, \$320 - 380 choice VF

CHAGHATAYID KHANS: Tuqa Timur, 1272-1291, AR dirham 619. (2.00g), Baldat Taraz, AH688 (backwards), A-1985, lovely strike, with only a tiny spot of weakness by the rim, VF, R \$130 - 160



CHAGHATAYID KHANS: Anonymous, ca. 1290s, AE jital 620 (3.41g), NM, A-G1987, Tye-, cf. Zeno-87535, bold strike lovely VF, RRR \$160 - 200

Inscribed 'adil khan padshah around the dynastic tamgha on obverse, be-qovvat-e aferidegar-e 'alam (as on #3778) on the reverse. Probably struck prior to the jitals citing Khutlugh Khwaja by name, either by Khutlugh Khwaja himself or an underling of his contemporary, Duwa Khan.

The State of Chu was an ancient Chinese state in the Yangtze valley during the Zhou Dynasty. Originally Chu was considered a viscounty but, starting from King Wu in the early 8th century BC, the rulers of Chu declared themselves kings on an equal footing with the Zhou rulers. Originally known as Jing and then as Jingchu, Chu occupied vast areas of land at its height, including most of the present-day provinces of Hubei and Hunan, along with parts of Chongqing, Guizhou, Henan, Anhui, Jiangxi, Jiangsu, Zhejiang,

and Shanghai.

The hao in the reverse inscription shi hao probably refers to ten ant nose type coins. These spades are thick and robust with well developed rims all the way around, with a large round hole in the top.

The inscription written in seal script translates as "Tai Qing, Prosperous and Happy" and is attributed to the Tai Qing period of Emperor Wu. A hoard was discovered in Jiangsu containing 4,000 tai qing feng le coins with various other sorts of coins showing that this is not an amulet as had been claimed by some authorities.



The Society's headquarters were in the Yuyuan Gardens of Shanghai. The organization was founded in the 1850s during the upheavals of the Taiping Rebellion by Liu Lichuan. He took the nien hao (reign title) of Tian Yun (heavenly movement). It was one of a number of rebel groups to arise during this period, either affiliated with or proclaiming support for the rebel Taiping administration. The name ("Small Swords") refers to daggers used by warriors or martial artists in close combat. It is believed to be linked to triads. The society consisted mainly of natives from Guangdong and Fujian, including Li Shaoqing, Li Xianyun and Pan Yiguo, directors of some of the huiguan or native place associations of Shanghai. Liu Lichang was killed in February 1855. Those caught in possession of these coins were sent to trial and many were executed.



The only references to these were from the 'Money Company' coin auction of September 1984 and a Gregory G. Brunk article in the Numismatics International "Bulletin" of July/August 2009. This coin was picked from bags containing 30,000 coins put aside during WWII as the Japanese were melting Chinese coppers for the war effort. Only 100 of these countermarked pieces were found in the bags on various host coins of which about 20% had clear countermarks.


