Since our last auction, we have been told that these were found not far from the Karatoya (Korotoa) River in Bangladesh, in the region of Mahasthangarh, somewhat north of the city of Bogra. Their dating is uncertain, as they may have been produced for some sort of local coinages centuries after the suggested dates here. They are the easternmost of all known punchmarked coins.

There is little information regarding the hoard, but from what has thus far appeared in the market, both in India and elsewhere, it seems as though the total number should be somewhere between about 60 or 70 pieces to as many as 100 to 150. It appears that most pieces bear several banker's marks on the reverse, occasionally one or two on the obverse (the "river" side), always wtih a great variety of different marks.






