Produced during the Mughal occupation of Cooch Behar (Koch Bihar) between 1661-64 while Raja Pran Narayan retreated to the mountains and waged a guerrilla war for three years before finally making a pact with the Mughal Nawab Shaista Khan in 1664. A similar specimen sold in the Spink Auction 13019, Lot 222 (September 2013) for £1400.

The Mughal forces under Mir Jumla occupied the capital of Assam in 1662/63, forcing the local raja, Jayadhvaja Simha, to pay tribute to the Mughal Emperor, and it is possibly that this coin was struck for that payment. The mint was originally read as Sham, but a recent discovery revealed the alif before the name, so the mint is Assâm (thanks to Paul Stevens for this information).



The heavy rupees of Shah Alam Bahadur were struck at a few mints, principally in AH1123 with regnal year 5, more rarely 1123 year 6, plus a very few examples of 1122 year 4 and 1122 year 5. The analysis of these heavy rupees by Alan Deshazo was published in the ONS Journal #220 (summer 2014). He shows that at least 10 mints produced these, all very rare, and production was mandated by an Imperial Farman that was retracted very shortly afterwards.



The Coorg War was fought between the British East India Company and the State of Coorg in 1834, after which it became a province of British India. In 1837, a major insurrection broke out in the western part of the province instigated by the Tulu-speaking Gowda farmers which was finally quelled after a lengthy drawn-out operation. The Kodava chieftains who had largely remained impervious to nationalist sentiment assisted the British with men, money and logistics, and were rewarded with land grants, titles and the Coorg medal which has English text on it. This medal is uniface with only Persian text and it is uncertain which side and in which conflict it was issued in.

The British annexation of the Sikh Empire concluded on 29 March 1849, but the year VS1906 did not commence until 28 April 1849. It is likely that the 1906 dies were produced in advance, and for whatever reasons, used for the last coinage of the previous year. Rupees of Amritsar dated VS1905 are rare, and 1906 extremely rare. The chattra form on this piece was used only in 1905 & 1906, quite different from the form used in VS1899-1901, and never in 1902, so that it would seem improbable that the "6" of the date was a retrograde "2".

The Sikh Empire was dissolved in VS1906 (1849) by the British forces, and it is conceivable that Bharpur Singh's administration felt more secure abandoning the Sikh inscription, but for reasons we have not been able to determine, restored the Sikh text later in the same year.
