404. JAHWARID OF CÓRDOBA: temp. Abu'l-Walid Muhammad, 1042-1058, AV fractional dinar (0.83g), Qurtuba, AH44x, A-D399, VyE-1390 ("Banu Chahwar"), the middle two letters of the mint name, and the date section arba'in are both clear on this example, usual weakness, VF, RRR \$600 - 800

> Only anonymous were struck by the Jahwarids, at Córdoba AH439-442; none are listed on CoinArchives.





405. TAIFAS AFTER THE ALMORAVIDS: Anonymous, 1146-1155, AV dinar (3.79g), NM, AH[5]41, A-405var, bears the name al-mahdi billah on the obverse, with illegible titulature below, choice EF, RR \$900 - 1,100 All Arabic legends are somewhat stylized, with many misspellings and peculiarities. This is likely a Christian imitation, before the commencement of Christian Arabic dinars under Alfonso VIII in 1174. The additional circle of beads around the obverse center is unique to this variety.





406. IDRISID: 'Abd al-Wahab, ca. 790s, AE fals (3.60g), Tahirt, ND, A-N430, the precise service of 'Abd al-Wahab is unknown, but the relationship to the Idrisids is likely, light porosity, VF, RRR

Tahirt is the modern Tiaret in Algeria. A few examples of this type were found together with a few Abbasid fulus of Walila, as Lot 383 in this auction.

MIDRARID: al-Shakir, 933-958, AV dinar (4.13g), NM 409

[Sijilmasa], AH337, A-453, lightly crinkled, VF-EF



KHAZRUNID: Wanudin, 1048, AV fractional dinar (0.72g), NM, 410. ND, A-455A, in the sole name of the fictitious Spanish Umayyad caliph 'Abd Allah, unpublished, VF-EF, RRR \$400 - 500

The full gold dinar of Wanudin has been well-attested, though still very rare. It is probable that all Khazrunid silver & gold coins were struck at Sijilmasah or nearby.

 ALMOHAD: Abu Hafs 'Umar, 1248-1266, AV dinar (4.63g), Sabta (Ceuta), ND, A-491, H-524, struck from worn dies, VF-EF\$400 - 500



414. MERINID: Abu Yahya Abu Bakr, 1244-1258, AV ¼ dinar, A-522, with reverse phrase wa ma bikum / min ni'ma / fa-min Allah, somewhat crudely struck as usual, ANACS graded EF40 \$140 - 160 Recent research has reassigned this type to 'Uthman II, 1310-1331.





415. **MERINID: Abu Sa'id 'Uthman II**, 1310-1331, AV dinar (4.65g), Fès, ND, A-527, H-739, citing the ruler by name, some minor weakness, above-average strike, VF-EF \$400 - 600





416. **'ALAWI SHARIF: Isma'il al-Samin**, 1672-1727, AV dinar bunduqi (3.44g), Hadrat Fès, AH1120, A-583, KM-28.1, EF \$240 - 280



417. 'ALAWI SHARIF: Muhammad al-Yazid, 1790-1792, AR muzuna (0.61g), Fès, A-606, E-437, probably undated, typical crude strike of the period, VF, RR \$100 - 150

419. **TULUNID: Khumarawayh**, 884-896, AV dinar (4.06g), Misr, AH276, A-664.1, citing the caliph al-Mu'tamid and al-Mufawwidh, heir-apaprent to the caliphate, VF \$250 - 300





420. **TULUNID:** Harun, 896-905, AV dinar (4.39g), NM, AH286, A-667.1, unusual variety without mint name, though likely struck at the standard Egyptian mint, citing the caliph al-Mu'tadid, VF, **RR** \$400 - 500





421. **TULUNID: Harun**, 896-905, AR dirham (2.62g), Misr, AH289, A-668.1, caliph al-Mu'tadid, excellent strike, lovely VF, RR \$200 - 300





422. **IKHSHIDID: Abu'l-Qasim**, 946-961, AV dinar (3.36g), Filastin, AH337, A-676, modestly cleaned, VF \$200 - 300





423. **FATIMID: al-Mahdi**, 909-934, AV dinar (4.18g), al-Qayrawan, AH297, A-688, Nicol-23, first year of Fatimid coinage citing the caliph by name, VF-EF \$900 - 1,100





424. **FATIMID: al-Mansur**, 946-953, AV dinar (4.12g), al-Mahdiya, AH337, A-694, Nicol-241, month of Dhu'l-Qa'da, VF R

428. **FATIMID: al-Zahir**, 1021-1036, AV dinar (4.06g), al-Mahdiya, AH418, A-714.1, Nicol-1593, fully clear mint & date, with letter 'ayn below obverse field, choice EF, RR \$600 - 800

Nicol knew of only one specimen, but could not confirm the date on that piece.

436. HAMDANID: Nasir al-Dawla & Sayf al-Dawla, 942-967,
AR dirham (6.23g), Amid, AH332, A-748, one of the rarest
Hamdanid mints, and a very rare date as well, some light
adhesions, VF, RR \$200 - 240





437. **'UQAYLID: Muzahir al-Dawla Rafi' b. al-Husayn**, 1009-1033+, AR dirham (3.70g), Tikrit, AH410, A-E760, Zeno-131511, with the laqab *dhu'l-munâqib*, date somewhat weak, but must be 410, citing the Buwayhid ruler Sultan al-Dawla (403-412), VF-EF, **RRR** \$350 - 400

All coins of Muzahir al-Dawla were struck at Tikrit (also transliterated Takrit in numismatic literature), and all are extremely rare.

440. AYYUBID: al-Nasir Yusuf I (Saladin), 1169-1193, BI dirham aswad (0.82g), al-Qahira, ND, A-790, Zeno-109090, very rare \$250 - 300 on round planchet, with 1 flan crack, Fine, RR





441. AYYUBID: al-Nasir Yusuf I (Saladin), 1169-1193, AE fals (3.37g), Halab, AH584, A-792, Zeno-119071, lovely strike, full clear date, bold VF \$100 - 150





442. AYYUBID: Anonymous, ca. early 13th century, glass jeton (4.17g), A-793.2, completely blundered Arabic text, partly retrograde, small chip, VF \$70 - 90

One of the finest known specimens of this relatively common type, struck with frozen date for at least 10-15 years.

RASSID: al-Mansur al -Qasim, 999-1003, AV dinar (1.94g), San'a, AH389, A-1069M, citing the ruler as the caliph & son of the Prophet, al-mansur billah / amir al-mu - / - minin al-qa'im / bin rasul Allah, Sunni kalima on obverse, mount removed, with only minor damage by the edge, VF, RRR \$700 - 9



454. SULAYHID: 'Arwa bint Ahmad, 1091-1137, AV ½ dinar, Dhu Jibla, A-1078.1, blundered date as usual, ANACS graded EF45 \$120 - 160

SULAYHID: LOT of 4 debased gold imitative dinars, based on the Sulayhid type of 'Ali b. Muhammad, struck at Zabid with frozen year AH451, type A-1073.3, Mitchiner-536, all in VF condition, retail value \$400, **lot of 4 pieces** \$250 - 350

Vladimir Suchy has suggested that these were issued by Hamdinids in the region near San'a. See Zeno-104985 for his theory.

457. AYYUBID OF YEMEN: al-'Adil Abu Bakr, 1229-1233, AR dirham (1.81g), Bukur, AH628, A-1098.1, citing the Abbasid caliph al-Mustansir, extremely rare mint in northern Yemen, choice VF, RR \$200 - 300



458. **AYYUBID OF YEMEN: al-Kamil Muhammad I**, 2nd reign in Yemen, 1233-1236, AR dirham (2.15g), 'Adan, AH632, A-1099, EF. **R** \$110 - 150

An Important Group of Oman



459. **WAJIHID: 'Umar b. Muhammad**, fl. 968-969, AR dirham (2.99g), 'Uman, AH358, A-1163E, citing the Buwayhid overlords Rukn al-Dawla & 'Adud al-Dawla, plus the Abbasid caliph al-Muti', excellent strike, choice VF, RRR \$2,000 - 3,000



460. AMIR OF OMAN: Anonymous, 969, AR dirham (2.60g), 'Uman, AH358, A-1163U, totally anonymous, with only the first portion of the kalima in the obverse center, mint/date formula around, Qur'an Sura 112 in reverse field, verse 9:33 in margin, Buwayhid style, some surface porosity, unpublished and presumably unique, VF, RRRR \$3,000 - 4,000

The first coins dated 358 struck at 'Uman cite the last of the Wajihids, 'Umar b. Muhammad, the second is this previously unreported anonymous type, and the third is the issue in the name of the local ruler Hallâj b. Hâtim towards the end of the year. Both the issues of 'Umar and Hallaj cite the Buwayhid overlords and the Abbasid caliph al-Muti', but this type is totally anonymous. Due to the confusion during that year, it is possible that this type was struck at a different Omani mint than the other types.

Hatim, 968-972, AR dirham (2.71g), 'Uman, AH358, A-A1164, citing the Buwayhid overlords Rukn al-Dawla & 'Adud al-Dawla, plus the Abbasid caliph al-Muti', without the father's name Hatim, as found on Hallaj's coins dated 359-362, bold strike, some very light porosity, VF-EF, RR

These three coins of 'Uman dated AH358 provide a complete set of all three silver dirhams struck during that year, none recorded at auction in CoinArchives.





462. MUKRAMID: Nasir al-Din, 1020-1036, AV dinar (4.67g),
'Uman, AH421, A-1164, citing as overlord the Buwayhid ruler
Abu Kalijar, decent strike for this series, EF, RR \$800 - 1,000

463. MADAGASCAR / EAST AFRICA: AV dinar (4.14g), A-A1192, contemporary East African imitation in barbarous style of common type of al-'Aziz (Nicol type A), date & mint completely blundered, all inscriptions imitative, never mounted and not from the Diego Suarez hoard, EF-AU, R \$400 - 500





464. MADAGASCAR: Anonymous, ca. 1020-1050, AV dinar (2.98g), A-A1192, derived from the Ma'nid dinar of 'Adan, AH406 (as is clear on the obverse of this type), formerly regarded as Ziyadid, in the name of the Ziyadid ruler al-Muzzafar b. 'Ali, same dies as item #154414, ex-mount, EF, ex Diego Suárez hoard \$300 - 400

The hoard contained 14 examples of this type from the same dies (items #154414-154427), nearly all in EF condition, suggesting that they were relatively new when the belt was formed. Given the similarity to the Madagascar find pieces derived from the type of the Fatimid base (as these are as well, via the Ma'nid type based thereon), these should also be of Madagascar origin in the period ca. 1025-1050.

In our opinion, all issues bearing the title al-khaqan may have been struck 15-25 years before Möngke, during the last years of Chingiz Khan or slightly later. None of the coins confirmed for Ögedei and his Great Mongol successors bear that title, always either qâ'ân or qân. The legend mangu khan could be a version of the name Möngke with the title khân, or the equivalent of the phrase mangu khani that means "khan's money" or "khan's coin", first cited on copper dirhams in the name of Chingiz Khan at Samarqand, dated AH624. This is one of only two examples that bear a mint name, the other Zeno-68443 with the mint name tentatively read as Tun, a city of some importance not far from the two cities named Tabas, both in south central Khorasan.

Emperor Qinzong was the ninth emperor of the Song Dynasty of China, and the last emperor of the Northern Song. The Jurchens of the Jin Dynasty invaded Kaifeng in January 1127 and captured the 26-year-old Qinzong, the Grand-Emperor Huizong, along with the entire Song imperial family, including dozens of government officials in the Jingkang Incident, thus ending the Northern Song Dynasty. Qinzong, along with his father, was demoted to the rank of commoner on 20 March 1127, and on 13 May 1127, he was deported to faraway and bitter cold Northern Manchuria, where he was to spend the last 34 years of his life in confinement.

The large characters at the extreme right and extreme left are not Chinese, but rather Daoist "magic writing". While Daoist priests would like for the meaning to be kept a secret, these particular magic writing characters can now be understood. Regarding the very large character on the left, the upper half is "magic writing" for the Chinese character lei, which means "thunder" and refers to the "God of Thunder". The lower part is "magic writing" for the Chinese character ling, which means "to order". Because these inscriptions frequently requested the God of Thunder (Lei Gong or Lei Shen) to use thunderbolts (ting) to kill the bogies or evil spirits, these amulets are often referred to as "Lei Ting" charms or "Lei Ting Curse" charms.
