Little is known about this bronze pattern, but the Khmer calligraphy on this type differs from the white metal British-made patterns of similar design. The crudeness of strike might indicate this type was produced locally. Examples have sold in Numismatica Genevensis and Stack's Bowers & Ponterio. This type is published by Howard Daniel on page 114 of his book, Cambodian Coins and Currency.

This type appears to be unpublished in the SCWC and by Howard Daniel. This is the largest and heaviest 'hamza' bird type we have yet encountered.

This type of award medal was instituted by Nasir al-Din Shah about AH1289 (1872), the earliest year recorded by Rabino for award medals. The first issues were crudely struck in both silver and gold. Later during his reign, the medals were struck by modern machine presses, as this piece. Nearly all pieces were mounted for display.

Known as the Sultan Abu Bakar Medal, it was authorized in 1883, but always dated AH1303 (10 October 1885 to 29 September 1886), in gold or gold-plated, and bronze, and probably also in silver. It was issued to commemorate Abu Bakar's acquisition of the title Sultan, and was subsequently awarded to individuals for invaluable service to the royal family.

Except for the 1867 4 pesos, the 1882 is the key collectible date of the denomination. The other dates of KM-151 (1880, 1881 and 1885) are all extremely rare. Many 4 pesos were melted in the Revolution of 1896, making surviving specimens that much scarcer.

This piece is among the first machine struck coins of Morocco. Authorization to produce this issue was granted January 13, 1787, under Sultan Muhammad III. Although listed in some references as a pattern, this issue was clearly intended for circulation. The production started September 22, 1787. A total of 10,000 pieces were struck from bullion stored in the city of Tangier. Although well executed, for multiple reasons this issue was destined for failure. The first reason was logistical, as the shipment arrived late, after the death of Muhammad III. The new Sultan Muhammad al-Yazid would not want to place these coins of the previous ruler into circulation. The coins also bear the name of the Madrid Mint in Arabic. This would compromise their acceptance among the Moroccan people as there was tension between the two countries. Nearly the entire mintage was recalled and melted down, and as few as 10 specimens are known to have survived.

Christian IV was from the German house of Oldenburg and ruled Denmark and Norway for 59 years. His reign was not only the longest of the Danish monarchs, but also of all Scandinavian monarchs. He was a popular and active ruler, creating a stable and prosperous environment for his people. He did, however, involve Denmark in several wars, foremost of which was the Thirty Years' War. The country had to surrender some of its territories and bore a heavy cost to the economy due to the war. The other thing Christian IV is most noted for was changing the name of the capital city Oslo to Christiania, a name which was used until 1925.



Minister under Louis Philippe I, then President of the Council in 1836 and 1840, Adolphe Thiers then became the head of the order of the Assembly. He was arrested in 1851 during the dissolution of the Empire. He was allowed to return the following year, and dropped out of politics for a number of years. He was elected to the French Chamber in 1863 and 1869 as an opponent of the Empire. In 1871 he was appointed head of executive power of the Government of National Defense. A group of radicals were then elected, known as the Paris Commune. Fighting then broke out between Empire forces and those of the Commune. Many Parisiens were executed by Empire forces during what became known as "Bloody Week." Thiers eventually became the first President of the Third Republic, a post he held for two years.

Designed and engraved by Benedetto Pistrucci and Jean Baptiste Merlin. George IV became Prince Regent during the final bout of his father's mental illness. Upon the death of George III in 1820, he became king, and his coronation was a lavish affair. He chose to let his ministers run the Government, a practice which began in his Regency. He led a life of excess, which along with his poor relationship with his father and wife, led to him being an unpopular monarch.

2103. **GREAT BRITAIN: George VI**, 1936-1952, AR medal, General Service Medal, with PALESTINE 1945-48 clasp with new ribbon, issued to SIGMN. T. M. LAYDEN R. SIGS., light surface hairlines, EF \$100 - 150

Part of the resolution of the 1936-39 revolt was the imposition of an immigration quota for Jews wishing to enter Palestine. This was opposed by the Jewish settlers in Palestine and in 1944, a guerrilla war was launched against the British forces there, principally by the Irgun and Lehi. While service in this conflict prior to 1945 is counted as World War Two service, service between 27 September 1945 (the date a "state of emergency" was declared) and 30 June 1948 (when the last British troops departed) is acknowledged by this clasp to the General Service Medal (GSM).



2104. **GREAT BRITAIN: Elizabeth II**, 1952—, AR medal, Africa General Service Medal, with KENYA clasp with new ribbon, issued to FUS. G. WILLIAMS R.N.F., light surface hairlines, EF \$100 - 150

This clasp was awarded fifty years after the medal was introduced for service between 21 October 1952 and 17 November 1956 during

the Mau Mau Uprising by the Kikuyu people. A large number of British regiments and Royal Air Force squadrons received the medal. Issued to a member of the 49 Infantry Brigade of the Royal Northumberland Fusiliers.
