This magnificent example is as close to a true proof that could have been manufactured at the Tehran mint, using equipment newly imported from Europe. The details of the lion's face and beard are extraordinarily sharp, and there is a trace of cameo surface, especially on the obverse. The inscription on the reverse is also incredibly sharp, despite a trace of double-striking most visible in the ruler's name, as one might expect on an early strike from newly acquired dies. There also exists a proof or specimen version believed to have been struck at the Brussels mint, of which a specimen sold by Heritage in 2014 for \$20,000 (Auction 3033, Lot 23326). The Brussels type can be readily distinguished by the position of the ray extending from the sun-face through the lion's tail, thinner and closer to the tip of the tail on the Tehran strike, thicker and further from the tip of the tail on the Brussels type. The Brussels type also has three rays emerging to the left of the lion's head, whereas there are none there on the Tehran piece. The Brussels rays end with a blunt point, whereas Tehran rays are relatively sharp at the edge. Finally, the bottom folds of the wreath's ribbon below the lion is very different. This piece is clearly the Tehran mint product, perhaps a specimen strike from the Tehran mint. It is unquestionably superior to even the finest regular examples of the same type and year.



On July 1st, 1994, a second som currency was introduced at a rate of 1 new som = 1,000 old som. Two series of coins have been issued for the second som. They can normally be distinguished by the script used for the Uzbek language. The first series was written in Cyrillic script, while the second series is written in Latin script. These 'pattern' coins have O'zbekiston Respublikasi around national arms on each obverse, which differs from circulation coinage which has O'zbekiston Markaziy Banki around in Latin script. Antoine, comte Roy (1764-1847) was a French lawyer and politician. He was a National Representative during the Hundred Days when Napoleon returned from Elba, a Deputy from 1815 to 1821, a peer of France and three times Minister of Finance. Nicolas-Pierre Tiolier (1784-1843) was a French sculptor and engraver of coins and medals. He succeeded his father as 16th general engraver of coins in September 1816 and held this position until the end of December 1842. He engraved the seals of Louis XVIII, Charles X and the Order of the Holy Spirit, and also engraved medals for Louis-Philippe. He was made a knight of the Legion of Honor in July 1825.



Following the defeat of Egyptian forces in the Anglo-Egyptian War of 1882, Great Britain occupied the former Ottoman province, though the latter empire still claimed suzerainty even after Egypt was declared a British protectorate in 1914. In order to formally reinstate their influence in the region, Ottoman forces attacked British forces in Egypt the following year, with powers during the first world war starting to align themselves. This particular medal was a jab by Goetz at Sir Edward Grey, then British Foreign Secretary, urging him to stand up to the rising unrest against the British occupation of the region. 
