 393. UMAYYAD OF SPAIN: 'Abd al-Rahman III, 912-961, AV ¼ dinar (1.01g), al-Andalus, DM, A-349, citing the official Sa'id, therefore struck AH323-329, reverse off-center, VF-EF, R, ex Stephen Album Auction 17, Lot 203 \$400 - 450



 394. UMAYYAD OF SPAIN: 'Abd al-Rahman III, 912-961, AR dirham (2.12g), al-Andalus, AH321, A-350.3, citing Muhammad, rare subtype struck only 320-321, VF, RR \$100 - 150



 395. UMAYYAD OF SPAIN: Hisham II, 976-1009, AV dinar (4.11g), [Sijilmasa], ND, A-353S, citing the laqab of the caliph, al-mu'ayyid, lovely bold strike, choice EF, RRR, ex Stephen Album Auction 19, Lot 412 \$600 - 700

This and the following example are probably posthumous issues, perhaps struck between about AH405 and 425, prior to the commencement of Khazrunid coins, which were presumably also struck only at Sijilmasa, circa 430s-440s, and are calligraphically derived from this prototype.

398. UMAYYAD OF SPAIN: Sulayman, 1009-1010 & 1013-1016, AV dinar (4.14g), [Sijilmasa], uncertain date, A-357S, with his laqab al-musta'in in the middle line of the obverse field, possibly dated AH405 in Sulayman's 2nd reign, but as always at this mint, the date is very coarsely written, unpublished, EF, RRR, ex Stephen Album Auction 19, Lot 414 \$1,000 - 1,400



399. UMAYYAD OF SPAIN: Hisham II, 1010-1013, AV dinar (3.71g), A-359var, totally blundered mint & date, with the title al-mu'tadid billah replaced by al-mulku lillah, suggesting that the actual ruler was unknown, bold VF, RRR, ex Stephen Album Auction 22, Lot 313 \$800 - 1,000

Appears to be unpublished, as it is likely a local imitation struck during the chaotic period that lasted about 30 years after the collapse of Hisham's first reign in 1009 (AH399).

400. UMAYYAD OF SPAIN: LOT of 9 silver dirhams in lovely condition, all of the mint of al-Andalus: AH154, 161, 195, 197, 200, 230, 260, 392, and 401, a few strong VF, but most are EF, excellent representative selection, retail value \$650, lot of 9 pieces \$350 - 550

405. **MURCIA: Muhammad b. Sa'd**, 1147-1171, AV dinar, Mursiya (Murcia), AH552, A-407.1, minor weakness of strike, ANACS graded EF45 \$900 - 1,100



406. NASRID OF GRANADA: Muhammad VIII, 1417-1419 & 1431-1432, AV dinar (4.64g), Gharnata, ND, A-E412, cited with his ancestry as al-ghani billah muhammad b. yusuf b. yusuf b. yusuf b. muhammad b. yusuf b. isma'il b. nasr, bold strike, lovely EF, RR \$2,000 - 2,500



407. IDRISID: Yahya b. Idris II, 828-847, AR dirham (1.08g), DM, A-428var, brockage of the reverse, with name yahya bin idris below the reverse field, much later style, probably attributable to a much later governor with the same name, VF-EF, RRR \$100 - 150



408. IDRISID: Ibrahim b. al-Qasim, 880-893, AR dirham (1.59g), al-Basra, AH281, A-427E, clear mint & date, latest known date for this ruler and one year later than the previously reported last year of AH280, some weakness, very rare with legible date, Fine, RRR \$130 - 170



409. **IDRISID: Ibrahim b. al-Qasim**, 880-893, AR dirham (2.52g), al-Basra, DM, A-427E, about 15% flat strike, VF, **R** \$130 - 170



410. **IDRISID: Ibrahim b. al-Qasim**, 880-893, AR dirham (1.73g), MM, AH26x, A-427E, probably dated AH267 and struck at al-Basra, nice strike, choice VF, **R** \$100 - 150



411. **IDRISID: Ibrahim b. al-Qasim**, 880-893, AR dirham (2.78g), al-Basra, A-427E, date appears to end in *sab* or *tis*', early style, so date either 267 or 269, clear mint name, VF, **R** \$100 - 150

Dirhams of Ibrahim b. al-Qasim struck at al-Basra (in Morocco) are known with several dates between 267 and 281.





Minting was confined to the central authorities during this period. These coins usually have a raised rim on the top of the hole on the obverse. Their quality was so high that forgery became unprofitable except to true artisans, great villains, or thieves. All earlier coins were to be melted down and the copper taken to Shang Lin.

The Western Liao (1124-1218) dynasty, also known as Qara Khitay state, was founded by Yelü Dashi, a member of the Liao royal family, who led the remnants of the Liao Dynasty to Central Asia after fleeing from the Jurchen conquest of their homeland in the North and Northeast of modern day China. The empire was usurped by the Naimans under Küchlük in 1211. The empire was finally destroyed by the Mongol Empire in 1218.

Due to the high value of tea in many parts of Asia, tea bricks were used as a form of currency throughout China, Tibet, Mongolia, and Central Asia. Tea bricks were in fact the preferred form of currency over metallic coins for the nomads of Mongolia and Siberia in the early 20th Century. The average brick was valued at 1 Szechuan-Tibet rupee or 8 ga-den tangkas, and used for paying wages, buying provisions, and in ordinary trading.

In the period 1975 to 1985 molds of this design were used in the Peoples Republic of China to produce more tea bricks for sale as novelty items and tea and for drinking. The main difference between these and the originals made in the 1930s is in the quality of tea and its still fresh odor. There is one other subtle point that helps in making a positive identification. The original bricks have a seven-character Chinese legend at the bottom of the front design, while the modern bricks have eight characters.
