Formerly misidentified as money items, these are individually hand-made, acid-etched iron amulets, ca. 1950-1980s, from Surabaya, East Java. Joseph Cribb, in Magic Coins of Java, Bali and the Malay Peninsula, pp.68-69, tells how an enterprising man created the hybrid Hindu/Islamic designs, successfully promoted them as powerful amulets, and built a family business around their manufacture. Most are roughly rounded with crude pseudo-Arabic script, thumbprint designs, and (on larger sizes) dragons.

Philip VI's reign was plagued by a succession dispute. When Charles the Fair died in 1328, the nearest male heir was Edward II of England, through his mother, Isabella of France. The prevailing thought in France was that Edward III was ineligible to inherit the throne through the female line according to old Salic Law. Edward at first seemed to accept Philip's accession, but through a series of disagreements, events led to the beginning of the Hundred Years War.

Jean II's reign was frought with turmoil. The beginning of the Hundred Years War and the great plague got the new dynasty off to a bad start. Unable to levy taxes, it resorted to monetary transfers to replenish the treasury. These manipulations caused extremely unpopular devaluation of the currency.

 - Bertrand Andrieu (1761-1822) was a French engraver of medals. He was born in Bordeaux. In France, he was considered the restorer of the art, which had declined after the time of Louis XIV. This set was produced ca.1815 with two custom fitted trays in a 27cm x 35cm wooden box constructed like a gilt-edged book. One of the trays contains eight medals, the other two large medals. The spine is decorated with eagles and is inscribed in English: NAPOLEON MEDALS. This set of medals, encased in a false book, was made for the British market after the fall of Napoleon. A lovely old set of the period!

 - Joseph Haydn (1732-1809) was a prolific Austrian composer of the Classical period. He was instrumental in the development of chamber music such as the piano trio and his contributions to musical form have earned him the epithets "Father of the Symphony" and "Father of the String Quartet."
