1929. **KUSHAN: Kanishka I**, ca. 127-147, AE half unit (8.42g), Mitch-3065 ff, king standing // sun-god Helios, fabulous strike with full inscriptions around obverse, bold VF, **R** \$140 - 180





1930. KUSHAN: Kanishka I, ca. 127-147, AE unit (17.67g), Mitch-3082/84, king standing // Athsho, the deity of metals, bearded, excellent strike for this type, VF \$100 - 150





1931. KUSHAN: Huvishka, ca. 155-187, AV dinar (7.84g), Mitch-3196, G-286, half-length bust of king, nimbate, crowned with pointed crown, holding mace & spear // Ardoksho standing right, holding cornucopiae, VF \$800 - 1,000

Rare variety with to left of the second trident. This type is considered a posthumous issue, which then became the prototype for the first Kushano-Sasanian gold coinage under Peroz I (240-270), thus struck during the reign of the Kushano-Sasanian ruler Ardashir (230-245, no gold known in his name) or during the first 10 to 20 years of the reign of Peroz I.
