394. **SULAYHID:** 'Ali b. Muhammad, 1047-1081, debased AV dinar (1.97g), NM, ND, A-1075.3, probably struck locally in Yemen, perhaps by the Hamdanids of San'a, EF-AU \$100 - 120



395. SULAYHID: Queen 'Arwa bint Ahmad, 1091-1137, AV ½ dinar (1.07g), Dhu Jibla, A-1078.1, blundered date, probably derived from AH487, EF \$120 - 160



396. AYYUBID OF YEMEN: al-Mu'izz Isma'il, 1197-1202, AR dirham (2.17g), Ta'izz, AH598, A-1093, in the name of al-Mu'izz Isma'il as al-imam al-hadi ila al-haqq,, which he claimed in 597 and was deposed the following year, VF-EF, R \$200 - 250



397. AYYUBID OF YEMEN: al-Nasir Ayyub, 1202-1214, AR dirham (2.16g), 'Adan, AH606, A-1094.2, engraver's error in the date, which is incorrect order, to be read as either sitt wa sittmi'a sana or sana sittmi'a sitt wa, EF



398. AYYUBID OF YEMEN: al-Mas'ud Yusuf, 1214-1228, AR dirham (2.13g), Ta'izz, AH620, A-1096.1, citing the deceased Ayyubid of Egypt, Abu Bakr I, as overlord, together with his heir-apparent al-Kamil, and the caliph al-Nasir, VF-EF, R \$150 - 200



399. AYYUBID OF YEMEN: al-Mas'ud Yusuf, 1214-1228, AR dirham (2.09g), Zabid, AH626, A-1096.2, citing the Ayyubid of Egypt, al-Kamil, as overlord, and the caliph al-Mustansir, EF, R \$150 - 200



400. AYYUBID OF YEMEN: al-'Adil Abu Bakr, 1229-1233, AR dirham (2.10g), San'a, AH627, A-1098.1, citing the Ayyubid of Egypt, al-Kamil, as overlord, and the caliph al-Mustansir, much weakness, VF, R \$100 - 150

An unpublished rarity from 'Uman (Oman)

Yusuf, 952-961, AV dinar (4.24g), 'Uman, AH341, A-A1163, Darley-Doran—, citing the caliph al-Muti', with religious phrase below the ruler's name, and the dynastic word wajih below the reverse field, star right in obverse field, pellet right in reverse field, unpublished and of the highest rarity (probably unique), VF, RRRR \$4,500 - 5,500

Darley-Doran cited only a silver dirham of the year 341 (page 132), and cited the existence of dinars of 'Umar b. Yusuf dated 345 and 347. No gold coinage of 'Umar b. Yusuf is recorded on CoinArchives (and only three silver dirhams, dated 340, 342 and 343).

Dinars of the three brothers dated AH648 are from a recent hoard, of which the first examples appeared at auction in December 2011. The total size of the hoard remains unknown.




