Coins of the Revolution reflect the rapidity of change. Originally, as France experimented with a constitutional monarchy, Louis XVI's portrait remained on coins but the royal coat of arms on the reverse was replaced with the iconic Spirit of France. In 1792 the Republic was established and in 1793 Louis was executed. New currency without Louis' portrait was hastily brought into circulation in 1793. and coins featuring a woman representing liberty appeared in 1795.

Schraubthalers became fashionable toys in seventeenth-century Germany, with Augsburg a particular center of their manufacture. To make a schraubthaler, a thaler or pair of thalers was cut in half along the edge and hollowed out, with a groove added so that the two halves could be screwed or pressed together. One could place small pictures inside: religious symbols, portraits, or other miniature pictures were common.

He was in charge of the evacuation of Philadelphia in the Revolutionary War, Governor General of Jamaica, Acting Governor General of Canada, Commander in Chief of the British Forces winning the 4th Anglo Mysore War, and then Governor General of India.

On 19 January 1725, the Akerendam, a ship of the Vereenigde Oostindische Compagnie (Dutch East India Company) departed the

Netherlands as part of a convoy bound for Batavia. Manned by a crew of 200 and carrying 19 chests of gold and silver on board, she sank in a snowstorm on 8 March 1725 near the cliffs of Runde Island on the Norwegian west coast. During the following months, five chests of coins were recovered from the wreck. The remainder remained undisturbed, until Swedish and Norwegian sports divers rediscovered the wreck site in 1972, when approximately 57,000 gold and silver coins were recovered. Of these, 6,600 gold coins were mostly the rare Dutch gold ducats minted in Utrecht in 1724, which, prior to this recovery, were known only through a handful of specimens. Because of the location of the recovery, these coins are known as the 'Runde Treasure'. The Norwegian state's portion of the Runde treasure was divided between the University of Oslo's Coin Cabinet and Bergen Maritime Museum. In January 2011, some of the coins from the Maritime Museum were transported back to the island for an exhibition at Runde Miljøsenter. The divers' portion of of the treasure was auctioned in Switzerland in 1978.
