The anabates or calpe ('dismounter') race was a late introduction to the Olympics, in which the rider dismounted for the last stretch and ran beside the horse. Its origin was probably a military exercise since speed and agility were essential for a horseman in battle, and it is still included in modern gymkhanas. A Rare and Lovely Tetradrachm of Demetrius I & Laodice IV





460. Prior to becoming a Seleucid king, Demetrios I was held hostage in Rome in keeping with the terms of the Treaty of Apamaea of 188 B.C. During his detention a succession of kings ruled the Seleukid world, including Demetrios' father Seleukos IV, his uncle Antiochos IV and his young cousin Antiochos V. At a time when the Romans were punishing Antiochos V for treaty violations, Demetrios escaped captivity, raised an army and landed in Syria in the fall of 162 B.C. He found quick support, and his rival Antiochos V was soon executed, leaving Demetrios the new Seleukid king.




