# Islamic Coins Early Pre-Reform



811. **ARAB-SASANIAN: 'Abd Allah b. al-Zubayr**, 680-692, AR drachm (4.14g), DA+P (Fasâ), YE54, A-16, letter P for the mint suffix located atop DA for Darabjird; Pahlavi monogram at 11:30 in reverse margin, superb strike, choice AU \$130 - 170



ARAB-SASANIAN: Yazdigerd type, 652-668, AR drachm (3.74g),
 SK (Sijistan), year 20 (frozen), A-1, first Islamic coin, VF \$110 - 140

This type is distinguished from last regular Sasanian issue of the same regnal year of Yazdigerd III by addition of Arabic bism Allah in ObQ2



813. **ARAB-SASANIAN: Yazdigerd type**, 652-668, AR drachm (3.19g), SK (Sijistan), year 20 (frozen), A-1, first Islamic coin, VF \$110 - 140

Countermarked human hand in ObQ4; mark not recorded by Göbl.



814. **ARAB-SASANIAN: Yazdigerd type**, 652-668, AR drachm (3.84g), BN (possibly Bamm), year 33, A-1, pellet at 11:30 in reverse margin; the Islamic phrase *bism Allah* in ObQ2 has been scratched out on this piece, presumably by a non-Muslim opposed to the Muslim faith, very rare mint for this type, VF, **RR** \$200 - 300

The year 33 is written SYCSY in Pahlavi, which could also be interpreted as the Muslim year AH33 rather than the posthumous Yazdigerd year 33 (AH33 = YE22).

Abi Sufyan, with 3 countermarks in the obverse margin: G-3 (forepart of lion); variant of G-40 (tamgha above longer Bactrian legend); and variant of G-109 (tamgha & apparently Sogdian legend), VF. R \$150 - 200



816. ARAB-SASANIAN: 'Abd Allah b. 'Amir, ca. 661-664, AR drachm (4.20g), DA (Darabjird), year 43 (frozen), A-6, struck circa AH43-47 without change of date, EF \$120 - 160



817. **ARAB-SASANIAN: Ziyad b. Abi Sufyan**, 665-673, AR drachm (4.16g), DA (Darabjird), year 43 (frozen), A-8, struck circa AH50-52, gorgeous strike, choice EF-AU \$130 - 170



818. ARAB-SASANIAN: Ziyad b. Abi Sufyan, 665-673, AR drachm (3.90g), NAL (Narmashir), AH53, A-8, with countermark #3 (forepart of a lion) in ObQ4, bold VF \$110 - 140



819. ARAB-SASANIAN: 'Ubayd Allah b. Ziyad, 673-683, AR drachm (4.14g), DA (Darabjird), YE46, A-12, superb bold strike, EF-AU \$130 - 170



820. ARAB-SASANIAN: 'Ubayd Allah b. Ziyad, 673-683, AR drachm (4.12g), DA (Darabjird), YE49, A-12, Pahlavi monogram at 11:30 in reverse margin, EF-AU \$110 - 150



821. **ARAB-SASANIAN: 'Ubayd Allah b. Ziyad**, 673-683, AR drachm (4.16g), DA (Darabjird), YE50, A-12, choice EF-AU \$130 - 170



822. ARAB-SASANIAN: 'Ubayd Allah b. Ziyad, 673-683, AR dirham (5.16g), NY (probably Nihawand), AH58, A-12, incredibly heavy weight for this type, pierced, VF-EF \$120 - 160



823. ARAB-SASANIAN: 'Ubayd Allah b. Ziyad, 673-683, AR drachm (4.30g), BCLA (al-Basra), AH60, A-12, remarkably heavy, EF \$100 - 130



824. **ARAB-SASANIAN: 'Ubayd Allah b. Ziyad**, 673-683, AR drachm (4.05g), GD (Jayy), AH62, A-12, choice EF \$120 - 160



825. ARAB-SASANIAN: Mu'awiya, 661-680, AR drachm (4.07g), DA (Darabjird), frozen year 43, A-14, struck circa AH52-54, bold strike, choice EF, R \$200 - 250

Mu'awiya was the first caliph to place his name on Islamic coinage, struck briefly only at Darabjird.

828. ARAB-SASANIAN: 'Abd Allah b. al-Zubayr, 680-692, AR drachm (4.07g), KLMAN (Kirman), AH67, A-15, pellet at 6:30 in reverse margin, cleaned, VF-EF \$120 - 160



829. **ARAB-SASANIAN: 'Abd Allah b. al-Zubayr**, 680-692, AR drachm (4.10g), DA (Darabjird), YE53, A-16, pellet at 0:30 in reverse margin, fantastic strike, AU \$130 - 170

Jahrom and Fasa are two small cities in the Darabjird district, both quite active for the later Arab-Sasanian coinage, periodically in later periods.

837. ARAB-SASANIAN: 'Abd al-'Aziz b. 'Abd Allah b. 'Âmir, ca. 685-691, AR drachm (3.91g), SK (Sijistan), AH66, A-25, with Arabic al-'aziz, without the triplet of pellets, in ObQ3; one minor adhesion near the rim, bold VF, R \$130 - 170

839. ARAB-SASANIAN: 'Abd al-Malik b. Marwan, Umayyad caliph, 685-705, AR drachm (4.15g), DA+P (Fasa), YE60, A-32, nice strike, choice EF \$140 - 18



840. ARAB-SASANIAN: 'Abd al-Malik b. Marwan, Umayyad caliph, 685-705, AR drachm (4.12g), DA+P (Fasa), YE60, A-32, nice strike, choice EF \$140 - 180

Mirza Collection \$500 - 600

Yusuf, 694-713, AE pashiz (1.44g), NM, ND, A-B37, Gyselen-79, standard bust right, with governor's name in Arabic, kalima in the margin, as on his silver drachms dated AH76-77 // Orans figure (Muslim at prayer), facing to the right, with very large left hand, with the name of al-Hajjaj in Pahlavi to the right, moderate porosity, F-VF, RRR \$150 - 200



844. **ARAB-SASANIAN:** al-Hajjaj b. Yusuf, 694-713, AE pashiz (0.64g), NM, ND, A-B37, Gyselen-79, standard bust right, with governor's name in Arabic, kalima in the margin, as on his silver drachms dated AH76-77 // Orans figure (Muslim at prayer), facing to the right, with very large left hand, with the name of al-Hajjaj in Pahlavi to the right, lightly porous surfaces, Fine, **RR** \$120 - 160



845. ARAB-SASANIAN: al-Hajjaj b. Yusuf, 694-713, AE pashiz (0.58g), NM, ND, A-C37, Gyselen-62, facing portrait, name to the right in Pahlavi // horse facing right, Pahlavi text above, read by Gyselen as PWLYC / APAD above, some porosity, VF RR \$120 - 16



846. ARAB-SASANIAN: al-Hajjaj b. Yusuf, 694-713, AE pashiz (0.32g), NM, ND, A-C37, Gyselen-62, facing Sasanian-style bust, with the governor's name in Pahlavi to the right (HCAC Y WSPAN) // horse right, Pahlavi text above, read by Gyselen as PWLYC / APAD (partly unclear on this piece), Fine, RR \$110 - 150



847. ARAB-SASANIAN: al-Hajjaj b. Yusuf, 694-713, AE pashiz (0.50g), NM, ND, A-D37, Gyselen—, Sasanian bust facing towards the right, without the surrounding radial legend, governor's name in Arabic to right // Orans figure (praying Muslim), his hand emphasized, governor's name in Pahlavi to right, minor porosity, unpublished and none recorded on CoinArchives, VF, RRR \$180 - 220



848. **ARAB-SASANIAN: 'Abd al-Rahman b. Muhammad**, 700-703, AR drachm (3.95g), SK (Sijistan), AH81, A-38A, choice EF \$100 - 120



849. ARAB-SASANIAN: Anonymous, ca. 700-720, AE pashiz (0.79g), NM, ND, A-N41, Gyselen-65, facing bust both sides, derived from the Anahita type silver drachm of Khusro II (Göbl-218/219), nice strike, but some light porosity, VF \$100 - 130



850. ARAB-SASANIAN: Anonymous, ca. 700-720, AE pashiz (0.54g), NM, ND, A-N41, Gyselen-65, facing bust both sides, derived from the Anahita type silver drachm of Khusro II (Göbl-218/219), decent strike, F-VF \$100 - 130



851. ARAB-SASANIAN: Mansur, ca. 700-705, AE pashiz (2.12g), ST (Istakhr), ND, A-D42, Gyselen—, name MNSWL in Pahlavi right of bust, LWBAK in ObQ2 // standing caliph, with his sword, as on the Syrian standing caliph fulus, but with his hands raised, pierced, light porosity, VF, RRR \$200 - 300



852. ARAB-SASANIAN: Anonymous, ca. 690-710, AE pashiz (0.75g), Bishapur, ND, A-42, Gyselen-7, single Byzantine-style facing bust // crowned human-headed bull, touch of porosity, nice VF \$110 - 150



853. ARAB-SASANIAN: Anonymous, ca. 690-710, AE pashiz (0.70g), Bishapur, ND, A-43, Gyselen-8, two Byzantine-style facing busts, derived from a follis of Heraclius & Constantine // crowned human-headed bull; much rarer than Gyselen-7 of the same mint, F-VF \$110 - 150

Although without mint name, the type is usually found at Susa, so was likely struck at Susa or nearby.

The "5" of the date is very clear (Pahlavi PNC), followed by either HSh for the beginning of "80" or ShS for the start of "60", but by style the year 85 seems more likely, presumably the Hijri date.



876. **EASTERN SISTAN: Khusro type**, ca. 680s-700s, AR drachm (4.02g), SK (Sijistan), blundered date, A-P75, reverse crescents have 3-branch leaf instead of stars, EF \$120 - 160



877. ARAB-HUNNIC: "Gorigo Shah", ca. 687-688, AR drachm (3.73g), Anbir (near Juzjan), AH68, A-90, SICA-1:7 (same dies). G-275, standard Sasanian design, with the ruler's name zolooo gozogano "the Zolo of Juzjan" before the bust, tamgha in ObQ1, bism Allah in ObQ2, and Pahlavi GDH apzwt in ObQ3 // Pahlavi ombiro in RvQ8 (the city name), GDH in RvQ7, apzwt in RvQ6, and Pahlavi gorigo rooeo in RvQ5, the mint name in Arabic left of the left attendant, the date in Pahlavi right of the right attendant (HShTShS); bold strike, EF, RR \$1,400 - 1,600

Struck by one of the pro-Arab Hunnic groups, during the time of the Umayyad caliph 'Abd al-Malik b. Marwan (AH65-86).



878. ARAB-HUNNIC: "Gorigo Shah", ca. 687-688, AR drachm (3.77g), Anbir (near Juzjan), AH69, A-90, G-280, standard Sasanian design, with the ruler's name zolooo gozogano "the Zolo of Juzjan" before the bust, tamgha in ObQ1, bism Allah in ObQ2, and Pahlavi apzwt GDH in ObQ3 // Pahlavi ombiro in RvQ5 (the city name), GDH in RvQ6, apzwt in RvQ7, and Pahlavi gorigo rooeo in RvQ8 (opposite reverse margin arrangement compared to the AH68 issue), the mint name in Arabic left of the left attendant, the date in Pahlavi right of the right attendant (NWAShST); bold strike, with only some minor spots of weakness, choice EF, RR

Struck by one of the pro-Arab Hunnic groups, during the time of the Umayyad caliph 'Abd al-Malik b. Marwan (AH65-86). Formerly classified as Arab-Hephthalite.



879. ARAB-BUKHARAN: Muhammad, ca. 761-769, BI drachm (3.13g), ND, A-93, Sasanian-style bust right // stylized fire altar & two attendants, choice VF, RR \$140 - 180

The name Muhammad is believed to be the name of the future Abbasid caliph, al-Mahdi.





880. ARAB-BYZANTINE: Two Figure Phocas type, ca. 610s-640s, AE follis (9.04g), year "3", A-3500, based on the Antioch type MIB83, Gr-152, with mint name blundered and obverse legend meaningless, lovely brown patination, VF, R, ex CNG Auction 22, Lot 839 \$140 - 180

Struck before the Arab invasion, probably during the Persian occupation.

ARAB-BYZANTINE: Two Standing Figures, ca. 636-650, AE fals (5.17g), Neapolis (Nablus), ND, A-3505N, cross between the 2 standing figures // ANN both left & right of the capital M on reverse, mint formula NEA in exergue, officina A, same dies as Lot 166 in our Auction 19, average quality for this very rare mint, F-VF, RR \$200 - 250

The type is derived from the follis of Heraclius & his son Heraclius Constantine, struck 630-640, his regnal years 20-30 (Sear-810).





883. ARAB-BYZANTINE: Sicilian Imperial Bust, ca. 670s, AE fals (2.98g), "SCL", ND, A-3508, SICA 1:530 (same obverse die), beardless facing bust, derived from early issues of Constantine IV // monogram above capital "M", standing figures left & right, mint abbreviation below, F-VF, RR \$140 - 180

The obverse text has been reckoned as Pahlavi, but is quite meaningless and could be derived from Pahlavi, Arabic, Syriac, a mix thereof, or just random squiggles.





884. ARAB-BYZANTINE: Justin & Sophia type, ca. 675-700+, AE follis (8.51g), Jerash (Gerasa), ND, A-3509.2, INJ-13, type C8, seated Emperor, holding globus cruciger, and Empress, holding cross, mint name as [ ] to right // capital "M", letter within, host mint name below (retrograde!), ANNO left and XII right (with star above), porous surfaces, VG-F, RRR \$250 - 350





885. ARAB-BYZANTINE: Justin & Sophia type, ca. 675-700+, AE ½ follis (5.81g), Baysan, ND, A-3510, INJ-13, type B1 (same dies), seated Emperor and Empress, each holding cross, partial mint name around ( / ) // large letter , X above, I below, and , year VII, light porosity, VF, RR \$200 - 300



The example here corresponds to the equivalent of 1,250 piastres in gold. This 90g size medal is not published; only the 60g version appears to be published, but this medal is known in a variety of weights. A 60g example was sold in the Dr. Lawrence A. Adams Collection for \$13,000 in Triton XIX, Lot 2797. Another example weighing about 84g was sold in Gorny & Mosch Giessener Münzhandlung Auction 188, Lot 5778 for €16,000.

This is the heaviest specimen known to us.

This medal was struck with the new forty horsepower steam coining machinery which was brought to Turkey from England under the superintendence of William Joseph Taylor for the striking of new coin types based on the Monetary Reform of 1844. The Monetary Reform introduced the gold lira which was valued at 100 qirsh. From 1844 to 1881 the lira was based on two systems: it was worth 6.61519 grams of pure gold or 99.8292 grams of pure silver.
