# **Islamic Coins**

### Iran - The Seljuq Period



1214. **GREAT SELJUQ: Tughril Beg**, 1038-1063, AV dinar (4.14g), Nishapur, AH444, A-1665, with the title *shahanshah al-ajall*, VF \$160 - 200



1215. **GREAT SELJUQ: Tughril Beg**, 1038-1063, AV dinar (4.04g), Nishapur, AH445, A-1665, with the title *shahanshah al-ajall*, VF \$160 - 200



1216. **GREAT SELJUQ: Tughril Beg**, 1038-1063, AV dinar (5.65g), Nishapur, AH4xx, A-1665, with the title *shahanshah al-ajall*, VF \$200 - 260



1217. **GREAT SELJUQ: Bayghu**, 1043-1056, AV dinar (2.75g), Herat, A-1669, late issue, with the titles *al-malik al-muzaffar mu'izz al-dawla*, the date is possibly AH(44)8, VF, **R** \$150 - 180



1218. **GREAT SELJUQ: Alp Arslan**, 1058-1063, AV dinar (2.89g) (Herat), AH456, A-1671, with title 'Adud al-Dawla, VF-EF , *ex Yusuf Alokozay Collection* \$100 - 130



1219. **GREAT SELJUQ: Alp Arslan**, 1058-1063, AV dinar (3.71g), Marw, AH45x, A-1671, very clear mint name, crude VF, ex Yusuf Alokozay Collection \$100 - 130



1220. GREAT SELJUQ: Alp Arslan, 1058-1063, AV pale dinar (4.26g), Herat, AH(4)58, A-1671, somewhat crudely struck, a few spots of weakness, VF, RR, ex Yusuf Alokozay Collection \$160 - 180



1221. GREAT SELJUQ: Malikshah I, 1072-1092, pale AV dinar (3.53g), Herat, AH475, A-1675, royal titulature *al-sultan al-mu'azzam mu'izz al-din wa'l-dunya* in that order, lovely floral ornamentation around the obverse field, lightly polished, VF, RR \$120 - 160



1222. **GREAT SELJUQ: Toghanshah**, 1072-1082+, pale AV dinar (5.77g), Herat, AH(47)5, A-1678, citing Malikshah I as overlord, about 20% flat strike, clear mint & final digit of date, misaligned reverse die, VF, **RR** \$120 - 160

Citing the caliph al-Muqtadi, so the date must be AH475, not 465.



1223. **GREAT SELJUQ: Barkiyaruq**, 1093-1105, AR dirham (2.02g), al-Ahwaz, AH489, A-1682C, first known specimen with legible date, fully clear on this piece, VF, **RRR** \$160 - 220

All proper silver dirhams, inscribed "dirham", are extremely rare.



1224. **GREAT SELJUQ: Muhammad I**, 1099-1118, AV dinar (1.80g), uncertain mint, DM, A-1683.1, citing Sharaf al-Muluk Ilqafshit with uncertain patronym, very weak reverse, VF, **R** \$100 - 120



1225. GREAT SELJUQ: Sanjar, 1099-1118, AV dinar (3.64g), Nishapur, AH489, A-1685.1, citing Abu Shuja' Muhammad as overlord, clear mint & date, VF \$160 - 200



1226. **GREAT SELJUQ: Sanjar**, 1118-1157, AV dinar, pale gold (3.32g), Balkh, AH(52)2, A-1687, clear mint & date, usual flatness, with dragon above & below obverse field, sword & scepter on reverse, EF, ex Yusuf Alokozay Collection \$100 - 140



1227. KHWARIZMSHAH: Muhammad, 1200-1220, AV dinar (1.51g) (Nishapur), AH614, A-1712, some weakness of strike, crude VF \$90 - 120



1228. **KHWARIZMSHAH: Muhammad**, 1200-1220, AR dinar (5.55g) (Asta)rabad, AH61x, A-1712, VF, **R** \$200 - 260



1229. **KHWARIZMSHAH: Muhammad**, 1200-1220, AV dinar (4.00g), A-1712, blundered mint & date formula in the obverse margin, mint name perhaps *khuwarizm*, more likely local issue copying the mint name, VF, **R** \$140 - 160



1230. KHWARIZMSHAH: Muhammad, 1200-1220, AR medium dirham (1.84g), Dâwar, ND, A-1718.1, very rare mint for this type, unpublished variety, VF, RR \$100 - 140



1231. **KHWARIZMSHAH: Muhammad**, 1200-1220, AE jital (3.75g), [Qunduz], ND, A-A1739, Tye-233, Rajpur horseman right // ruler cited with the additional title *sikandar al-thani*, "the second Alexander," referring of course to Alexander the Great, lovely VF, **R** \$100 - 120



1232. GHORID: Ghiyath al-Din Muhammad, 1163-1203, AV dinar (5.88g), Herat, AH596, A-1754, without his brother Mu'izz al-Din Muhammad, clear date, mint name atop both obverse & reverse fields, pierced, typically crude strike for this type, Fine, R \$220 - 280



1233. **GHORID OF BAMIYAN: Jalal al-Din 'Ali**, 1206-1215, AV dinar (2.29g), Walwalij (sic), DM, A-V1806, *walwâlíj* is one of the many spellings found for the mint of Warwarliz, VF-EF, **R** \$120 - 160

Atabegs & Contemporaries



1234. ARTUQIDS OF MARDIN: Yuluq Arslan, 1184-1201, AE dirham (12.50g), AH589, A-1829.3, four figures in a "lamentation" scene, said to corroborate the death of Saladin in that year (AH589), short reverse central text, VF \$100 - 150



1235. **ZANGIDS OF AL-MAWSIL: Mas'ud II**, 1211-1218, AV dinar (4.78g), al-Mawsil, AH611, A-1866, slightly uneven surfaces, VF \$260 - 325



1236. LU'LU'IDS: Badr al-Din Lu'lu', 1233-1258, AV dinar (4.76g), al-Mawsil al-Mahrusa, AH657, A-1871M, citing the Great Mongol Möngke, without caliph's name, strong VF, R \$300 - 400

With the Persian text "khodavand-i 'alam padshah-e ruy-i zamin", "master of the world, emperor over the face of the earth", likely a title of Chinese origin.



SALDUQIDS: Nasir al-Dawla Ghazi, 1132-1145, AE fals (4.45g), 1237 ND, A-B1890, standing figure holding long cross and diadem, with cornucopia in background, possibly citing the Seljuq ruler Mas'ud, usual weakness near the rim, F-VF, RRR \$120 - 160



SALGHURID: Abish bint Sa'd, 1265-1285, AR dirham (2.81g), 1238. Shiraz, AH665, A-1930, Arabic inscriptions only, but with Chinese character bao sideways in the obverse field, citing only the Qa'an as overlord, slight central weakness, clear mint & date, \$450 - 550 VF. RR

According to the Ilkhan historian Vassaf, the Mongol governor Inkiyanu, assigned as co-ruler alongside Abish, was recalled and sent back to the court of Qubilai Qa'an, perhaps as far as China, for the indiscretion of having placed "a secret symbol" in the Chinese script on the coinage of Shiraz!

#### **Mongol Dynasties**



GREAT MONGOLS: Chingiz Khan, 1206-1227, AV dinar (3.14g) 1239 (Bukhara), ND, A-1964, SNAT-XVa:267 (same dies), Zeno-5001, citing Chingiz Khan by name: obverse legend chingiz khan / al-'adil a- / -l-a'zam, mint name at upper reverse (off flan on this example, confirmed by die-link), decent strike for this crudely \$2,200 - 2,600 manufactured series, VF, RR



GREAT MONGOLS: Chingiz Khan, 1206-1227, AV dinar (3.47g), 1240. ND, A-1964, very crude strike, the ruler's name appears in the third line of the obverse text, al-khaqan / al-a'zam / (chin)giz khan, crude strike as usual, with about 30% flatness, crude VF, RRR \$1,000 - 1,300

This appears to be an unpublished style for gold dinars in his name. It is either without mint name, or with mint name off flan, either at the bottom of the reverse or in the obverse or reverse margin. We could not find a die-match to any other example on CoinArchives or Zeno.



- GREAT MONGOLS: Chingiz Khan, 1206-1227, AR dirham 1241. (3.10g), NM, ND, A-1967, citing Chingiz Khan by his name, dies 3/B (as indicated in the Zeno chart), wonderful strike, \$900 - 1,100 EF. R
  - Believed struck during the Mongol march through Ghazna against Mangubarni b. Muhammad, the last Khwarizmshah.



GREAT MONGOLS: temp. Chingiz Khan, 1206-1227, AE broad mansuri dirham (6.75g), Samarqand, AH617, A-1968var, mint & 1242. date on both sides, apparently unpublished variety, dated within his lifetime, VF-EF, RRR \$260 - 350

Samarqand broad dirhams are called "mansuri" for 617, either burhani" or "'adili" for 618, and "qadiri" for 619 (sometimes misinterpreted as 617), thus continuing the tradition of Khwarizmshahi broad dirhams of Samarqand under 'Ala al-Din Muhammad dated AH610-616.



- GREAT MONGOLS: temp. Chingiz Khan, 1206-1227, AV dinar 1243. (3.12g), NM, AH(6)18, A-A1967, clearly struck during the reign of Chingiz Khan, but the date is securely confirmed; about 15% flat strike, VF, RRR \$500 - 600
  - Together with Zeno-169146 & 219659 (both from the same dies as this piece), the date can be accurately pieced together as "sana thamania 'ashar wa sitmi'a" for AH618; most likely struck at Badakhshan, as they are stylistically so similar to some dinars engraved with that mint name (cf. Zeno-181537, where the mint name is legible).



1244. GREAT MONGOLS: temp. Chingiz Khan, 1206-1227, AE jital (4.27g), NM, ND, A-1969, bold strike, struck at or near Ghazna during the Mongol advance towards the Indus River, thus during the lifetime of Chingiz Khan, EF \$110 - 150



GREAT MONGOLS: temp. Chingiz Khan, 1206-1227, AE jital 1245. (2.99g), Kurraman, ND, A-1970, obverse legend 'adl khaqa- / -n al-mu'azzam / kurraman, almost certainly struck during the lifetime of Chingiz Khan, stylistically related to type A-1969, citing the caliph al-Nasir on the reverse, bold VF, RR \$140 - 180



GREAT MONGOLS: Anonymous, ca. 1220s-1230s, AV dinar 1246 (2.87g), Badakhshan, ND/DM, A-1965, obverse legend al-khaqan / al-'adil / al-a'zam, with the mint name above, part of Qur'an 9:33 in the margin, neatly engraved // standard kalima, uncertain margin, EF, RRR \$450 - 550

All other anonymous Great Mongol dinars on CoinArchives and in our Auction #10 (December 2010) have the kalima on the obverse and cite the caliph al-Nasir li-din Allah on the reverse.



1247. GREAT MONGOLS: Anonymous, ca. 1220s-1230s, AV dinar (3.84g), Astarabad, ND/DM, A-1965, obverse legend al-khaqan / al-'adil / al-a'zam, with the mint name above, kalima reverse, possibly dated in the reverse margin (off flan on this example), VF, RR \$350 - 450



1248. **GREAT MONGOLS: Anonymous**, ca. 1220s-1240s, AE jital (1.92g), NM, ND, A-—, Tye-—, generally as type A-B1973, based on Tye-332/333, but with single words *al-imam* on obverse and *al-a'zam* on reverse, style somewhat similar to Tye-332, VF-EF, **RR** \$100 - 130



1249. GREAT MONGOLS: Anonymous, ca. 1220-1250, AV dinar (2.65g), NM, ND, A-1966, standard kalima on both dies, without the caliph, but with the title *qa'an* below the obverse field, with the mint formula in the obverse field (*duriba hadha al-dinar bi-baldat* ....) followed by traces of the mint name, very likely Bukhara - this piece is of the Bukhara style, VF-EF \$300 - 400



1250. **GREAT MONGOLS: Anonymous**, ca. 1220-1250, AV dinar (2.65g), NM, ND, A-1966, standard kalima // citing the caliph *al-imam al-a'zam al-nasir li-din Allah* with the title *qa'an* above, decent strike for this type, VF-EF \$280 - 350



1251. GREAT MONGOLS: Anonymous, ca. 1220-1250, AV dinar (2.01g), Khujanda, ND, A-A1967, standard kalima, mint name below // citing the caliph *al-imam al-a'zam al-nasir li-din Allah*, and the denomination *khani* above, typically crude strike for this mint, EF \$250 - 300



1252. **GREAT MONGOLS: Anonymous**, ca. 1220-1250, AV dinar (4.28g), Bukhara, ND, A-B1967, totally anonymous, not even the caliph cited, mint name below obverse, crude strike, VF-EF \$280 - 350



1253. **GREAT MONGOLS: Anonymous**, ca. 1220s-1240s, AV dinar (2.99g) (Bukha)ra, ND, A-B1967, totally anonymous, with the short kalima on both sides and no mint name in the field; about 15% flat, 3 small flan cracks, VF \$260 - 325

Style of the several Bukhara dinars on Zeno.



1254. **GREAT MONGOLS: Anonymous**, ca. 1220s-1240s, AV dinar (3.25g), Bukhara, ND, A-B1967, only the kalima and the mint name in the fields of both sides, VF, **R** \$240 - 300



1255. **GREAT MONGOLS: Anonymous**, ca. 1220s-1240s, AV dinar (2.75g), NM, A-B1967, totally anonymous, with the kalima on both sides and no mint name in the field; about 20% flat, one flan crack, VF \$240 - 300



1256. **GREAT MONGOLS: Anonymous**, ca. 1241-1245, AV dinar (3.42g), Samarqand, DM, A-B1967, date off flan, but compares with the Samarqand anonymous dinars of this type dated AH640 (Zeno-162763) and (64)2 (our Auction 18, Lot 531); some weakness and one flan crack, nearly VF, **RR** \$350 - 450

This piece and the two examples noted above are from different dies, but stylistically are so similar that they were almost certainly engraved by the same die-cutter within a short period of time, probably during the reign of the Great Mongol Töregene (1241-1246, AH639-644).



1257. GREAT MONGOLS: Anonymous, ca. 1220s-1240s, AV dinar (4.13g), ND/DM, A-C1967, with unusual reverse legend al-imam a-/-l-a'zam amir / al-mu'minin, and with undeciphered mint name after baldat in the reverse margin, about 20% flat strike, very crude VF, RR \$400 - 500



1258. **GREAT MONGOLS: Anonymous**, ca. 1220s-1240s, AV dinar (3.69g), NM, ND, A-C1967, very sloppily engraved legends, probably only the kalima, double-struck, Fine \$140 - 180



1259. **GREAT MONGOLS: Ögedei**, 1227-1241, AR dirham (2.25g), Imil, ND, A-K1974, *tengri kuchundur* in Arabic script (Mongolian for "by the power of the eternal God") // *al-imam / al-a'zam* with mint name above, usual flatness, VF, **RR** \$100 - 130



1260. GREAT MONGOLS: Ögedei, 1227-1241, AR dirham (2.39g) (Imil), AH(6)35, A-K1974, *tengri kuchundur* in Arabic script (Mongolian for "by the power of the eternal God"), clear date in margin // *al-imam / al-a'zam* with mint name, F-VF, RR \$100 - 130



1261. **GREAT MONGOLS: Anonymous**, ca. 1260s, AR dirham (1.36g), NM, A-3747K, inscriptions *al-imam al-a'zam // khalifat Allah*, said to come from the region of Kaiyaluq, VF \$100 - 130



1262. GREAT MONGOLS: Anonymous, ca. 1260s, AR dirham (1.35g), NM, A-3747K, muling of the reverse inscription *khalifat Allah* on each side, said to come from the region of Kaiyaluq, VF \$100 - 130



1263. GREAT MONGOLS: Möngke, 1251-1260, AV broad dinar (2.86g), NM, ND, A-T1977, obverse legend mangu qan / al-'adil / al-a'zam, kalima reverse, typical crude strike, EF, R \$300 - 400 An example of the same used for this coin and lot 1264 below appeared in our Auction 10, Lot 846.



1264. GREAT MONGOLS: Möngke, 1251-1260, AV dinar (2.07g), NM, ND, A-T1977, obverse legend mangu qan / al-'adil / al-a'zam, kalima reverse, typical crude strike, narrow flan, EF, R \$300 - 400



1265. **GREAT MONGOLS: Möngke**, 1251-1260, AV broad dinar (4.76g), NM, ND, A-T1977, obverse legend *mangu qan / al-'adil / al-a'zam*, kalima reverse, very crude strike, EF, **R** \$240 - 300



1266. GREAT MONGOLS: Möngke, 1251-1260, AV broad dinar (5.63g), NM, ND, A-T1977, obverse legend mangu qan / al-'adil, without the third line al-a'zam, kalima reverse, very crudely engraved dies, weak strike, crude EF, R \$240 - 300



1267. **GREAT MONGOLS: Möngke**, 1251-1260, AV broad dinar (4.34g), NM, ND, A-T1977, obverse legend *mangu qan / al-'adil / al-a'zam,* kalima reverse, very crude strike, EF, **R** \$220 - 280



1268. **GREAT MONGOLS: Möngke**, 1251-1260, AV broad dinar (2.36g), NM, ND, A-T1977, obverse legend *mangu qan / al-'adil*, without the third line *al-a'zam*, kalima reverse, very crudely engraved dies, decent strike, crude EF, **R** \$180 - 220



- 1269. GREAT MONGOLS: Möngke, 1251-1260, AV broad dinar (5.07g), NM, Dhu'l-Hijja AH[6]51, A-T1977var, obverse legend mangu qan / al-'adil, with the third line bearing the date in words, dhu'l-hijja sanat ihda khamsin, kalima reverse, excellent strike for this rare variety, EF, RRR \$500 - 600
  - Same dies as lot 1270 and 1271 in this auction. The clear date AH[6]51 proves that the form "mangu" before the word "qan" refers to Möngke.



1270. GREAT MONGOLS: Möngke, 1251-1260, AV broad dinar (3.74g), NM, Dhu'l-Hijja AH[65]1, A-T1977var, obverse legend mangu qan / al-'adil, with the third line bearing the date in words, dhu'l-hijja sanat ihda (khamsin), kalima reverse; the only piece that shows the month in full, EF, RRR \$400 - 500



GREAT MONGOLS: Möngke, 1251-1260, AV broad dinar 1271. (4.30g), NM (Dhu'l-Hijja) AH[6]51, A-T1977var, obverse legend mangu qan / al-'adil, with the third line bearing the date in words (dhu'l-hijja) sanat ihda khamsin, kalima reverse, EF, RRR

\$280 - 350



GREAT MONGOLS: Möngke, 1251-1260, AV broad dinar (3.77g), Astarabad, ND, A-V1977, obverse legend mangu qan / 1272. al-'adil / al-a'zam, mint name above, kalima reverse, decent strike \$240 - 300 for this type, crude EF, R



1273 GREAT MONGOLS: Möngke, 1251-1260, AE fals (4.43g), Ghazna, A-1978E.1, Tye-337, Zeno-167714, reverse legend bi-baldat ghazna 'amaraha, although presumably dated, no example has yet been found that reveals the date, VF. RR \$100 - 130

The notes on Zeno state that only two examples of this type were found in the recent hoard of Möngke and Qarlughid jitals of Ghazna.



1274. GREAT MONGOLS: Anonymous, fl. 1260, AE jou (3.31g), Ghazna, AH658, A-1978E.3, struck during a time of uncertain authority at Ghazna, after the death of the Great Mongol Möngke (AH649-657) - a dated jou in the name of Möngke is known with dates 655 and 657, unusually well-centered, VF, RR \$100 - 140



GREAT MONGOLS: Anonymous, ca. 1240s-1260s, AE fals 1275. (1.62g), Multan, ND, A-1978-, Tye-361, nisf panja in circle-in-square // darb multan in square, EF, R \$100 - 120



GREAT MONGOLS: Anonymous, AR dirham (2.01g), ND, 1276. A-O1979, tamgha with uneven shoulders, "comma" to right (thus assigned to Imil mint), S-tamgha on reverse, average strike, \$100 - 130



GREAT MONGOLS: Anonymous, AR dirham (2.06g), [Imil], ND, 1277. A-O1979, uneven shoulder tamgha, "comma" to right (Imil mint), S-tampha on reverse, some lamination on obverse, VF \$100 - 130



1278. GREAT MONGOLS: temp. Ariqboka, 1260-1264, AR dirham (1.42g), Imil, AH660, A-1978, double-flower tampha of Arigboka (Arigh Boga) in the obverse center, blundered date formula around, mint formula around kalima on reverse, F-VF, R \$100 - 140



1279 GREAT MONGOLS: Anonymous, 1268-1269, AE dirham (7.08g), Bukhara, AH666, A-A1979.1, Davidovich-7, mint & date on both sides, with the mint epithet *baldat al-fakhira* in the margin, the mint name below the field, VF, R \$140 - 180

> Struck during the reign of the Great Mongol ruler Qubilay (1260-1294), and much rarer than the previous issue with the Chinese character in the obverse center (struck AH660-663).



GREAT MONGOLS: Anonymous, AE broad dirham (9.16g), 1280 Samarqand, AH(630), A-B1979, Dav-5, central inscriptions are in Persian, divided between obverse & reverse, translates to "in Samarqand and the environs of this city" // "whosoever does not carry (accepts this coin) will be a sinner" (translation on Zeno-4612), surface cleaned, F-VF, RR \$100 - 140





1281. GREAT MONGOLS: Shams al-Din (al-Mandal?), date unknown, AE jital (2.79g), ND, A----, Zeno-226304, unknown ruler, probably struck just after the demise of the Khwarizmshah 'Ala al-Din Muhammad, either in alliance with or opposed by the Mongols, thus well within the lifetime of Chingiz Khan, unpublished, \$150 - 200 VF. RRR

The reading "shams al-din" is also tentative, and he is perhaps entitled Îl-Muzaffar. The style is clearly derived from the Helmund (Ghur) region jitals of 'Ala al-Din Muhammad, who died in AH617 (1220), by which time the Mongol armies were advancing across this region, probably taking Ghazna later that same year. The mint name resembles something like "siyâkhâneh", but has not been identified. Other specimens are needed to decipher the legends in full!



1282. **GREAT MONGOLS: Anonymous**, ca. 1220s-1240s, AV dinar (3.12g) (Samarqa)nd, ND, A-B1967, totally anonymous, with the kalima on both sides and no mint name in the field; minimal weakness, one flan crack, VF \$260 - 325

Attribution to Samarqand is based on style and calligraphy.
1283. GREAT MONGOLS: LOT of 11 interesting coins: A-1979, AE fals ND, time of Chingiz Khan (2 pcs, both VF); A-K1974, AR dirham, type of Imil mint sometimes dated AH635 (VG, poorly struck); A-1977, AR dirham, Herat ND (VF); A-L1979, AR dirham, Kucha 662 (Fine, about 15% flat); A-S1979, AR dirham, Imil, blundered date (2 pcs, one VF with some adhesions, the other VG with much weakness), and Pulad DM (VG-Fine, 20% flat); A-2018, AR dirham, Bulghar ND (VF); Crude overstrike), and A-1753.1, AE dirham, Balkh DM (VF, usual weakness); retail value \$850, lot of 11 pieces

#### Chaghatayid Khans



1284. CHAGHATAYID KHANS: Anonymous, ca. 1260-1280, AE jital (3.63g), Ghaznayn, ND, A-1984Z, Tye-354, horseman holding lance // fi al-balad / ghaznayn, some weakness, VF, RRR \$100 - 120

The city was rarely called Ghaznayn before the 19th century, but that alternative was already used by al-Muqaddisi, who wrote in the late 10th century. Another example sold in our Auction 31, Lot 766.



1285. CHAGHATAYID KHANS: tamp. Qaidu, 1270-1302, AR dirham (1.85g), Almaligh, AH689, A-1985, Zeno-24274, clear mint & date, one die-break, edge defect, VF, R \$100 - 130



1286. CHAGHATAYID KHANS: temp. Qaidu, 1270-1302, AR dirham (1.88g), Andigan, ND, A-1985, cf. Zeno-37741, Chaghatayid and S tamghas on reverse, VF, R \$100 - 140



1287. CHAGHATAYID KHANS: temp. Qaidu, 1270-1302, AR dirham (1.89g), Kenjde, AH696, A-1985, very rare with clear date, VF, RR \$90 - 120



1288. CHAGHATAYID KHANS: temp. Qaidu, 1270-1302, AR dirham (1.78g), Otrar, AH690, A-1985, cf. Zeno-144948, S tamgha on reverse, scarce with legible date, Fine, S \$90 - 120

### A Gold Dinar of Ahmad Tekudar, A Coin of the Highest Rarity!

A very few specimens, perhaps 3 or 4 total, were found in the large Ilkhan gold hoard terminating with Baydu and a few pre-reform dinars of his successor Ghazan Mahmud that reached the market about 1994. None is recorded on Zeno or CoinArchives. This type was unknown to Diler, although he did list a unique Tabriz dinar with the name Ahmad in both Uighur and Arabic, dated 68x, that appeared in Spink Auction 31, Lot 310 in 1989, where it was correctly described as the first known gold coin of the Ilkhan Ahmad. No additional specimens are believed to have been found since the 1994 hoard.

The Western Liao or Qara Khitai, officially the Great Liao dynasty, was a Sinicized Khitan empire in Central Asia. A similar example was reportedly found in Central Asia. An example listed in the Classic Chinese Charms Book Volume 2, #664, has a similar obverse, but a totally different reverse, assigned by the author to the Liao Dynasty, and another, #660, with just 6 animals on each side, described as Liao or Yuan dynasty.






The term "coin tree" is usually associated with the traditional method of casting Chinese coins. By the time of the Tang Dynasty (618 -907 AD), the coins were being made in sand molds. Each mold would have a number of coin impressions so that many coins could be produced at a time. These coin impressions were connected by channels so that the molten bronze could be poured into the mold at one opening and then flow to all parts of the mold. Once the bronze had cooled and hardened, the two halves of the mold were separated and the coins removed. However, since all the coins were connected by the channels through which the bronze had flowed, the bronze in the channels had hardened as well resulting in all the coins being connected together. The metal object that came out of the mold actually looked like a small "tree." The main channel through which the bronze had flowed resembled the "trunk" of a tree. The smaller channels which ran from the main channel to each individual coin looked like "branches." The coins were the "leaves." The coins were then broken off of the "branches." This left a small metal stub, called a "sprue", on the edge of each coin where it had been attached to the "branch. The molding process would also leave a little excess metal on the edge of the coins. The sprues and excess metal needed to be filed off to improve the appearance of the coins. The coins, which all had square holes in the center, were then stacked onto a square metal rod. The combination of a square rod threaded through the coins' square holes locked the coins from rotating on the rod and thereby made it easier for the worker to file off the sprue and excess metal on the edges of the coins. Master Sergeant L.B. Whittier bought this coin tree while in Japan during the American Occupation. He was stationed with the U.S. Fifth Air Force at the Nagoya Air Base.

The Sichuan rupees which were struck in Kangding of alloyed silver are occasionally found with countermarks in Tibetan and or Chinese script and marks consisting of Western numerals or the English word "one". The meaning of most of these marks remains uncertain, but we can presume that they were applied to the coins by local authorities, such as monasteries or dzong dpon (district officials) in order to enforce the circulation of the Sichuan rupees made of low grade silver in a specific area of Tibet.

While the Nepalese mohars were circulating in Tibet, they were frequently cut for use as small change, as none of the smaller denomination Nepalese coins were used by the Tibetans. The two Nepalese mohar types which are mostly encountered as cut fragments are the mohar of Jaya Prakash Malla dated NS 856/1736 AD and the mohar of Pratap Simha dated SE 1697-1699/1775-1777 AD. The denomination of the Nepalese mohar was valued at  $1\frac{1}{2}$ Tibetan sho. The natural subdivisions were 2/3 (=1 sho), 1/2 (=3/4 sho), and 1/3 (=1/2 sho). Very conveniently, it was noticed that a straight line cut leaving 5 petals visible on the reverse produced a piece weighing almost exactly 2/3rd of the full coin. Similarly, if 4 petals were visible the coin was clearly cut in half, and if 3 petals were visible, then the coin was worth 1/3rd of the full coin. The denomination could be calculated just by counting the petals.

The obverse of the ga-den tangkas show the eight auspicious symbols of Tibetan Buddhism: umbrella of sovereignty, two golden fish of good fortune, amphora of ambrosia, lotus, conch shell, emblem of endless rebirth, banner of victory and wheel of empire. These are usually arrayed around a central lotus. Their actual order and specific designs varied over time. The two sides of the coin have the same orientation. Starting from the top, the legend in Tibetan on the reverse says: dga'-ldan pho-brang-phyod-las-rnam-rgyal (The Palace of Ga-den is victorious in all directions). The legend is written in such a way as to fit into eight circles.

This special tangka, struck in better silver than the normal ga-den tangkas, was distributed to monks during the Monlam Festival ("Great Prayer" Festival) in early 1910. The distribution most probably took place in the Kelzang Palace, which is located in the Norbulingka, the park and summer palaces of the Dalai Lamas in Lhasa.

Formerly it was assumed that these tangkas were distributed to monks on behalf of the 14th Dalai Lama in the late 1940s. The Tibetans referred to this Tangka as Tangka dkarpo sa rpa ("new white tangka") in order to distinguish it from the normal gaden tangkas. This coin circulated for some time at the value of 5 srang which shows the high inflation rate which was prevailing in Tibet in the 20th Century. In the 19th Century 61/2 tangkas were equivalent to 1 srang which corresponded to slightly more than 37 grams of silver. Taking the circulating value of this "Monk " tangka as a base, 1 srang was equal to about 33½ tangkas in 1953-54
