952. **KUNTALA: Punchmarked**, ca. 600-450 BC, AR ½ shatamana (6.33g), Ra-502/509, "pulley" with simplified swastika above, VF \$200 - 260



953. **CENTRAL INDIA: Anonymous**, 1st century BC, AE square (2.72g), Pieper-238 (this piece), lion to right, Indradhvaja and Ujjain symbol above, swastika on right, all in deep incuse square, uniface, EF, **RR** \$130 - 170



954. **CENTRAL INDIA: Anonymous**, 1st century BC, AE round (2.86g), Pieper-242 (this piece), elephant to right, Ujjain symbol above, railed tree and hill on left // parallel lines, lovely VF, **RR** \$140 - 180





955. **CENTRAL INDIA: Anonymous**, 1st century BC, AE square (1.65g), Pieper-243 (this piece), turtle flanked by two swastikas, uniface, bold VF, **RR** \$140 - 180



956. **CENTRAL INDIA: Anonymous**, 1st century BC, AE square (2.38g), Pieper-253 (this piece), railed tree on left, wheel and Ujjain symbol on right, taurine above, uniface, lovely strike, VF-EF, **RR** \$140 - 180



957. **CENTRAL INDIA: Anonymous**, 1st century BC, AE square (0.96g), Pieper-257 (this piece), six-armed symbol with alternating arrows and framed taurines, with a fish in each corner, uniface; fantastic example, virtually as struck, EF, **RRR** \$140 - 180





958. CENTRAL INDIA: Anonymous, 1st century BC, AE square (2.72g), Pieper-417 (this piece), Shiva standing, holding danda and kamandalu, three-arched hill right, wheel and six-armed symbol on left, bull-and-swastika countermark on top, uniface, a most remarkably issue, as countermarked types are almost never encountered, VF, RRR
\$180 - 220



959. **CENTRAL INDIA: Anonymous**, 1st century BC, AE square (3.08g), Pieper-456 (this piece), iconographically fascinating depiction of a water-tank with a central island, ducks swimming on the surface and fish and tortoise in the water // lotus, railed tree, 2 taurines, river, minor corrosion spot on the reverse, the only known published example of this remarkable type, with no other examples published to date, VF, **RRR** \$150 - 200



960. **CENTRAL INDIA: Anonymous**, 1st century AD, AE square (2.72g), Pieper-790 (this piece), bust right, with female features, wearing earrings, her hair tied with thick dots in the back // lion right, light porosity, mainly on the reverse, VF, **RRR** \$260 - 350

The femenine-looking portrait on this local Mandsaur region coin, with earrings and the hair tied with a thick dot in the back, is based on Satavahana inspiration.



961. **CENTRAL INDIA: Anonymous**, 1st century BC, AE square (1.65g), railed tree, taurine-in-arch on left, Indradhvaja on right, river at bottom, uniface; assigned to the region of eastern Malwa, exceptional quality, nearly EF, **RRR** \$120 - 160



962. CHERA: Anonymous, ca. 1st century BC, AE square (6.72g),
Mitch-35/39var, bow-and-arrow in center, axe, snake, hill,
elephant, and 3 fish around // bow and arrow, VF, R \$120 - 160



963. **DECCAN:** Anonymous, 2nd century BC, punchmarked AE rectangular (5.96g), Pieper 350 (this piece), large fish in a single punch, uniface, VF, **R** \$200 - 300

Such punchmarked fish type coins are rarely seen. Mitchiner (SI, pt 1, no.22) published a similar type from southern Deccan with additional hills above and below, but the fish alone, as on this coin, is otherwise unpublished.





964. **ERAN-VIDISA: Hastideva**, king, 1st century BC, punchmarked AE square (4.82g), elephant, river, railed Indradhvaja, taurine-in-arch and inverted Brahmi legend *hatideva(sa) //* taurine-in-arch, VF, **RRR** \$150 - 200



965. **ERICH:** Ishvaramitrasa, 1st century BC, AE square (2.95g), Pieper-519 (this piece), Brahmi legend *rajno ishvaramitrasa* in two lines // railed yupa, bold VF, **RR** \$120 - 160



966. **GARHWAL: Bhanuva**, circa 2nd century AD, AE round (2.43g), Pieper-1112 (this piece), Brahmi legend *rajno bhanuvasya*, ten-arched hill on top, river at bottom // Karttikeya standing, holding spear, VF, **RRR** \$160 - 200

Bhanuva was a local king of the mountainous Garhwal region, from which very few coins are known. S.C.Kala (1956) reported a similar type from the Lansdown hoard, but that coin had a six-arched hill and a six-headed Karttikeya.

967. **KASHMIR-SMAST:** LOT of 5 small copper coins, ca. 2nd-5th century: (1.) bust right // swastika, VF (2.) Sasanian-style bust right // vajra, VF (3.) bunch of grapes // uncertain symbol, Fine (4.) elephant // uncertain design, F-VF; and (5.) tamgha, uniface, F-VF; retail value \$400, **lot of 5 pieces** \$200 - 260





968. **KAUSAMBI: Anonymous**, 2nd century BC, cast AE square (2.15g), Pieper-967 (this piece), bull to left, taurine and swastika above, river below // Ujjain symbol and hollow cross left, railed tree right, EF, **R** \$120 - 160



969. **KAUSAMBI: Anonymous**, 2nd century BC, cast AE round (1.12g), Pieper-975 (this piece), bull right, tiny Ujjain symbol above // railed tree flanked by taurines, hill symbol below, EF, **RR** \$120 - 160



970. **KAUSAMBI: Anonymous**, 2nd century BC, cast AE round (0.92g), Pieper-960 (this piece), elephant to right, chakra above // Ujjain symbol, pellet between each of the arms, EF, **RR** \$120 - 160

Indian ancient cast copper coins are almost never found in the same quality as this piece.





971. **KAUSAMBI: Anonymous**, 1st century BC, cast AE damaru shape (6.90g), Pieper-961 (this piece), elephant to left, taurine above // railed tree; **unique**, the only published specimen of this type, VF-EF \$150 - 200

The heaviest damaru-shaped coin of Kausambi, and moreover, an apparently unique type.





972. KAUSAMBI: Jyesthadatta, king, 1st century BC or AD, AE round (2.87g), Pieper-982 (this piece), male figure to left, Brahmi legend jyesthada(tasa) on right // Lakshmi standing, choice VF, RRR \$150 - 200

This Jyesthadatta type was first published in BMC, pl.XLV, coin 10. Extremely rare, maybe a handful of specimens are known with no certain findspots. Kausambi attribution is tentative, but Ganges Valley origin is sure.



973. **KURARA: Anonymous**, 1st century, AE square (1.90g), Pieper-500 (this piece), Ujjain symbol with nandipada on left, railed tree on right, legend *kuraraya* on top // crisscross field, lovely VF, **RRR** \$150 - 200

Kurara was a city state in eastern Malwa.



974. NORTHERN INDIA: Anonymous, 1st century BC, AE square (1.47g), Pieper-1152 (this piece), bull to right, Ujjain symbol on right, inverted taurine on top // horse to right, swastika and legend (?) on top; unique!, VF-EF, RRR \$140 - 200

Uncertain northern Indian tribal coin inspired by Indo-Greek types, and the only known example of this type.





975. PALLAVA: Anonymous, ca. 5th century, potin unit (2.19g), cf. Pieper-752, Krishnamurthy-243, bull right // wheel, VF, RR \$140 - 200





976. **RAJGIR:** Anonymous, 2nd century BC, AE square (0.97g), Pieper-1046 (this piece), diagonally arranged cross within square frame, decorative border, uniface, bold VF, **RR** \$150 - 200

Rajgir was capital of ancient Magadha. Its early local coins are rare and only a few have been found in the ancient ruins of the town.





977. SATAVAHANA: Anonymous, 2nd century BC, lead round (1.98g), Pieper-597 (this piece), bull to left with groups of dots around, all within a square frame // Ujjain symbol with attached nandipada, VF, RR \$130 - 170





978. **SATAVAHANA: Satakarni**, 1st century BC, AE unit (10.33g), Mitch-CSI.144, Brahmi legend, citing Queen Naganika in the center, Satakarni around // Ujjain symbol, pellets in the orbs, Nandipada in each quarter, overstruck on undetermined host, F-VF, **RR** \$120 - 160



979. **SAURASHTRA: Post-Mauryan**, 2nd-1st century BC, AE square (3.73g), Pieper-433 (this piece), six-armed symbol on left, crude human on right holding taurine-topped standard, river below // frog, choice VF-EF, **RR** \$150 - 200

Struck copper coins of Saurashtra are much rarer than the earlier punchmarked silver.





980 SAURASHTRA: Post-Mauryan, 2nd-1st century BC, AE square (2.19g), five-arrow symbol on railing // two turtles, known obverse type, but unpublished with this reverse, choice VF, RR





981. SUKTIMATI: Anonymous, 2nd century BC, cast AE square (1.88g), Pieper-1007 (this piece), elephant to left, Indradhvaja on left, ladder below, Brahmi legend sutimati on top // railed tree on right; whorl symbol and Ujjain symbol on left, bold VF-EF, RR







982 TAXILA: Anonymous, 2nd/1st century BC, AE round (1.14g), three-arched hill // railed tree flanked by two adorants, on top hill, taurine, swastika and Indradhvaja, unpublished type in almost perfect condition, bold EF, RRR

Possibly, we see just two adorants doing homage to the centrally placed sacred tree, perhaps identifiable as specific cult figures, such as the six-headed goddess Shashti and her consort Karttikeya.





983. UJJAIN: Post-Mauryan, 2nd century BC, lead square unit (4.37g), Pieper-401 (this piece), railed tree, multi-armed symbol and Indradhvaja, taurine and swastika on left // Ujjain symbol; \$130 - 170 exceptional specimen! EF, R

Ujjain lead coins are rarely found within the series. This coin is the best preserved specimen of the type the consignor has ever seen.





984 UJJAIN: Anonymous, 1st century BC, AE rectangular (9.04g), Pieper-348 (this piece), horse right, horizontally placed railed tree above, Ujjain symbol below, river on left // Ujjain symbol, bold strike, choice VF-EF, RR \$130 - 170





985 VIDARBHA: Dharmabhadra, 1st century BC, AE rectangular (2.56g), Brahmi legend rajno dhamabhadasa, horizontally placed railed tree on top, bull below with taurine above and swastika on right // complex cross-like arrangement of dynastic emblem; fantastic strike, lovely dark patina, choice EF, RRR

Dharmabhadra was king during the pre-Satavahana period.



VIDARBHA: Satyabhadra, 1st century BC, AE square (2.82g), Pieper-585 (this piece), bull to right, tree on right; upside-down Brahmi legend sacabhada(sa) // swastika adorned with taurines, \$140 - 180 strong VF, R

Satyabhadra was king during the pre-Satavahana period.



987. WESTERN KSHATRAPAS: Anonymous, ca. 3rd century AD, AE square (1.28g), Pieper-840 (this piece), elephant (facing left which is rare) in dotted border // hill above river in dotted border,





988 INDO-GREEK: Menander I, ca. 155-130 BC, AR drachm (2.45q), Bop-2C (the rarest of his regular drachms), helmeted and draped bust of Athena right // owl to right, head facing, VF, R





989 INDO-GREEK: Diodemes, ca. 95-90 BC, AE square unit (8.19g), Bop-10A, the Dioskouri standing, each holding a spear // humped bull right, lovely chocolate patination and superb well-centered bold strike! EF, R





LATER INDO-PARTHIAN: Sanabares, ca. 135-160, AR drachm 990. (2.23g), Mitch-2645/46, Parthian-style bust left, Pahlavi letters S A behind // archer seated, clear Greek legend around \$180 - 220 naming the king, light porosity, nearly VF, R



991. KUSHAN: Heraios, the Kushan, ca. 1-30 AD, AR obol (0.47g), Mitch-2840/42, diademed bust of beardless tyrant right // soldier standing, holding the remnant of a wreath, reasonably legible Greek legends left & right, lovely strike, choice VF





KUSHAN: Huvishka, ca. 155-187, AV dinar (7.95g), G-177.1 992. (same dies), crowned and diademed half-length bust left, rising above the clouds, holding club-like scepter and ankus // Pharro , Hermes-Mercury) standing, nimbate, holding diadem and long spear, bold EF, RR \$1,200 - 1,400

Very rare type for Pharro, none listed on CoinArchives.





993. KUSHAN: Huvishka, ca. 155-187, AV dinar (7.97g), G--Huvishka seated, cross-legged, above the clouds, holding long scepter // the lunar deity Mao standing, holding short sword and extending his right arm forward, Kushan tampha to left, with the lower portion curved, lightly cleaned, VF-EF, RRR \$2,600 - 3,500

The obverse is from the same die as Göbl-299, which has the reverse of Nana. Another example from the same obverse die is paired with Ardoksho on the reverse (Donum Burns #275). The curled bottom of the tamgha is characteristic of the Mao and several other coinages of this series (Göbl-B), but infrequent on all other series.





994. **KUSHAN:** Vasu Deva I, ca. 191-230+, AV dinar (7.92g), Mitch-3395, king standing, offering sacrifice at altar, holding trident, second trident left, nandipada right // Siva and the Nandipada bull, pellet between the bull's hind legs, very late or posthumous issue, choice VF-EF \$450 - 500



995. **KUSHAN:** Vasu Deva I, ca. 191-230+, AV dinar (8.01g), Mitch-3396/97, king standing, sacrificing at altar, holding trident, second trident to left, rudimentary nandipada to right // Siva and the bull, off-center strike, but a bold strike, especially on the reverse, AU \$500 - 600



996. **KUSHAN: Vasu Deva I**, ca. 191-230+, AV dinar (8.00g), Mitch-3396/97, king standing, sacrificing at altar, holding trident, second trident to left, rudimentary nandipada to right // Siva and the bull, struck with slightly worn obverse die, superb bold reverse, choice AU \$500 - 600



997. **KUSHAN: Vasu Deva I**, ca. 191-230+, AV dinar (8.02g), Mitch-3396/97, king standing, sacrificing at altar, holding trident, second trident to left, nandipada to right // Siva and the bull, crudely struck on the obverse, bold reverse, AU \$450 - 550



998. **KUSHAN: Vasu Deva I**, ca. 191-230+, AV dinar (7.78g), Mitch-3396/97, king standing, sacrificing at altar, holding trident, second trident to left, nandipada to right // Siva and the bull, crudely struck on both sides, AU \$450 - 550



999. **KUSHAN:** Vasu Deva I, ca. 191-230+, AV stater (7.99g), G-696, king standing, sacrificing at altar, holding trident, second trident to left, crudely engraved nandipada to right // Siva and the bull, coarsely engraved, local issue, likely struck after the death of Vasu Deva, choice EF \$600 - 700





1000. KUSHAN: Kanishka II, ca. 226-240, AV dinar (7.82g), Mitch-3503, king standing, offering sacrifice at altar, holding trident, second trident left, legend Ga Gho Nu // Siva and the Nandipada bull, superb strike, especially on the reverse, EF-AU \$550 - 650



1001. KUSHAN: Kanishka II, ca. 226-240, AV dinar (7.84g), G-544var. Mitch-3501var, standard obverse, with Brahmi vi right of the staff, and no additional Brahmi characters // Ardoksho enthroned, with her name in full in Baktrian Greek, with uncertain Brahmi character at upper right, choice VF, RR \$850 - 1,000

Early style, closely resembling the second series of Vasu Deva I, thus confirming that Kanishka II must have reigned shortly after Vasu Deva, or even as a rival during the last years of Vasu Deva.

KUSHAN: Kipunada, ca 350-375, AV dinar (7.74g), Mitchiner-3584/88, king standing left, holding trident and sacrificing over altar, Na in Brahmi to right of altar, monogram BaSaTa under arm in right field, KiPuNaDa further to right // Ardoksho enthroned facing, holding garland and cornucopia, VF-EF \$200 - 250



1003. KUSHAN: Kipunada, ca 350-375, AV dinar (7.37g), Mitchiner-3584/88, king standing left, holding trident and sacrificing over altar, Na in Brahmi to right of altar, monogram BaSaTa under arm in right field, KiPuNaDa further to right // Ardoksho enthroned facing, holding garland and cornucopia, lightly cleaned, VF
\$200 - 250



1004. **KUSHAN: Gadahara**, ca. 360-375, AV dinar (7.76g), Mitch-3394/96, standard obverse, name *Kidara* beneath king's arm, king's name to right // Ardoksho enthroned, EF \$300 - 375



1005. POST-KUSHAN: Rudrabala, ca. 360-440, AE unit (4.98g), cf. Mit-3784, recumbent bull left, Brahmi ru below // Brahmi legend dra bota bala filling the field, bold VF, RR \$170 - 240





1006. KUSHANO-SASANIAN: Vasu Deva, AV scyphate dinar (8.01g), Göbl-694, early posthumous issue circa mid-3rd century, king standing left, holding trident and sacrificing at altar with trident, swastika between feet, degraded Bactrian legend around // Shiva standing facing, in front of bull Nandi left, OhPO (Shiva) to right, well struck with sharp details, EF \$500 - 800





1007. KUSHANO-SASANIAN: "Varahran", late 4th century, AV dinar (7.62g), Mitch-1314/15, cf. Cribb-11, standard design, with Kidara tamgha replacing the nandipada on the obverse, uncertain symbol below the tamgha // Siva & bull, usual crude reverse, EF \$550 - 650





1008. KUSHANO-SASANIAN: "Varahran", late 4th century, AV dinar (7.74g), Mitch-1314/15, cf. Cribb-11, standard design, with Kidara tamgha replacing the nandipada on the obverse, uncertain symbol below tamgha // Siva & bull, above average reverse, EF \$550 - 650





1009. GUPTA: Changragupta II, 383-412, AV dinar (stater) (7.81g), Mitch-4796 ff, Archer type: king standing, nimbate, holding arrow & bow, Garuda standard to left // Lakshmi, nimbate, seated on lotus, holding diadem & stylized cornucopia, legend sri vikrama to right, bold strike, finest style, choice VF-EF \$700 - 800





1010. GUPTA: Changragupta II, 383-412, AV dinar (stater) (8.21g), Mitch-4796 ff, Archer type: king standing, nimbate, holding arrow & bow, Garuda standard to left // Lakshmi, nimbate, seated on lotus, holding diadem & stylized cornucopia, legend sri vikrama to right, late style, bold VF \$650 - 800



1011. POST-GUPTA: Anonymous, 5th/6th century, lead round (1.19g), Pieper-895 (this piece), bull resting to right // ankusa, the only published example, extremely rare type, possibly derived from a Salankayana prototype, VF-EF, RRR \$160 - 200

1012. **CEYLON:** AE unit (4.21g), cf. Pieper-792, 23mm, elephant right, uncertain symbol above (conch shell?) // bull, kneeling down to right, double-crescent above, attractive F-VF, **RR** \$140 - 180

According to the consignor, this example was found in Myanmar!





1013. CHALUKYAS: Vishnuvardhana, early 7th century, AE round, uncertain alloy (3.54g), lion right, Brahmi legend shri vishamasiddhi // conch between lamps, border of rays; unpublished variety with additional honorific title shri and of very different style than published examples of this ruler, VF-EF, RRR \$260 - 350

Vishnuvardhana was viceroy under Pulakeshin II (608-644).





1014. CHITALDURG: Madakeri Nayaka I, 1565-1602, AV ½ pagoda, Mitch-937/38, Durga seated facing, wearing turreted headdress // Devanagari inscription, sri pratapa krishnaraya, superb strike, NGC graded MS64, R, ex Pattabhi Raman Collection \$200 - 260

The half pagoda of Chitaldurg is much rarer than the full pagoda. None of the examples on CoinArchives even approach this quality.

 VIJAYANAGAR: Hari Hara I, 1336-1357, AV pagoda, Mitch-1998:378, warrior walking right, with garment between legs, and dagger in scabbard at waist // Kannada legend in 3 lines sri vi / ra hari / hara, NGC graded AU55, R, ex Pattabhi Raman Collection \$220 - 280

The third Anglo - Maratha war (the Pindari war) ended in 1818 AD, with the defeat of the Marathas at the hands of the British East India Company forces led by Governor General Hastings. The Peshwas were defeated at the Battle of Khadki (Kirkee) on 5 November 1817 near Pune (Poona) and the city was seized by the British. It was placed under the administration of the Bombay Presidency. This type was struck from 1820-44, and issued by the EIC after the war ended in 1818. They were issued in the name of the Mughal Emperor so they would be accepted by the local people.

The Fasli Era has a 12 month calendar from July to June. Adding 590 to Fasli year = Gregorian calendar (AD). Fasli, which means harvest, is derived from the Arabic term for division, which in India was applied to the groupings of the seasons. The Fasli Calendar is a chronological system introduced by the Mughal Emperor Akbar. The 'nagphani' (serpent hood) mint mark resembles the spectacle markings on the hood of a cobra.

The Bombay Art Society is based in Mumbai and was founded in 1888. For some five or six years after the foundation of the Society, the Exhibits of the European Artists preponderated over those of the Indian Artists as shown by the catalogs of the Annual Exhibitions. The number of works by Indian Artists exhibited in subsequent years at the Society's Annual Exhibition later considerably increased and secured many medals and prizes. It was quite an achievement for Indian Artists under British Rule. By 1923 a total of one hundred and thirty-six entrants were Indian and only twenty were European. In Robert Puddester's book, the spelling of the gold medallist of 1928 is listed as Mrs. E. J. McMillan. Only 39 gold medals were issued between 1894 and 1947 in British India of both this type and the Victoria portrait type.
