## Iran - The Early Period





- 425. BANIJURID: Abu Da'ud Muhammad, 874-899, AR dirham (3.54g), Andaraba, AH277, A-1433, citing the caliph al-Mu'tamid, superb strike, the finest example of this type that we have seen, choice EF, R
- 426. BANIJURID & SAMANID: LOT of 6 multiple dirhams, type A-1439 of Banijurid al-Harith b. Harb (2), A-1465 of Samanid Mansur I (1), and A-1469 of Nuh III (3); all in VF or better grade; retail value \$300, lot of 6 pieces





427. **SAMANID:** Nasr II, 914-943, AV dinar (4.36g), Nishapur, AH323, A-1449, VF, ex Dabestani Collection \$240 - 280





SAMANID: Nuh II, 943-954, AV dinar (4.82g), Nishapur, AH339, 428. A-1454, citing the deposed caliph al-Mustakfi, lightly wavy \$220 - 260 planchet, VF





429. SAMANID: Ibrahim b. Ahmad, 947, AV dinar (5.55g), Nishapur, AH335, A-1458, nice strike, interesting die-break on the reverse, citing the caliph al-Mustakfi, with the phrase nasr min Allah wa fath qarib ("help is from God, and victory is near") around the obverse field, unusually heavy, VF, RR \$500 - 600





SAMANID: 'Abd al-Malik I, 954-961, AV dinar (3.81g), Nishapur, 430 AH343, A-1460, unusually with the reverse of AH344, which does not cite the deposed caliph al-Mustakfi, VF, S

SAMANID: LOT of 32 copper coins from many rulers from the period 819-997, including the following mints: Akhsikath (1 pc), Binkath (2), Balkh (1), Bukhara (12, including some rare pieces); Ferghana (1), Nawkat Ilaq (1, rare), Parak (1, very rare mint), Samarqand (3), al-Shash (9), and Usrushana (1); average F-VF condition, some with defects; retail value \$1000,

AMIRS OF MULTAN: LOT of 84 dammas: A-X4566, FT-M1-23: pre-Islamic prototype, thus before circa 712 (5 pieces); A-4575 (was A-1510), FT-M49: al-Rabi', early 800s (2); **A-4578**, (was A-1509), FT-M53/56, Shibl, ca. 840s-860s (25); A-4579, (was A-1505), FT-M59, Muhammad III, after 861/864 (40); and undetermined (12); mostly EF condition, from the hoard of the mid-2000s; retail value \$1100, lot of 84 pieces, ex Jim Farr Collection \$300 - 400
- 436 SHADDADID: LOT of 9 silver dirhams of al-Fadl I (983-1031), all struck at Janza (Ganja in Azerbaijan) and dated in the month of Muharram AH400, type A-1491, presumably all from the great hoard marketed about 30 years ago, now largely dispersed, all average strikes in EF condition, retail value \$400, lot of 9 pieces \$180 - 240





QARAKHANID: Ahmad b. 'Ali, 994-1016, AR dirham (3.16g), 437 Quz-Urdu, AH397, A-3304, citing the official Jawhar,

QARAKHANID: Ahmad b. 'Ali, 994-1016, AR dirham (2.70g), 438 Isbijab, AH398, A-3304, Zeno-118467 (this piece), citing the local governor Matt as bu 'ali, without his title mu'izz al-dawla; otherwise generally as Kochnev-189/193, lovely VF, RR \$140 - 180





439. QARAKHANID: Ahmad b. 'Ali, 994-1016, AE fals (2.08g), Nawkath, AH397, A-3305, Zeno-140210 (same obverse die), citing the ruler as al-amir al-sayyid al-malik al-muzaffar gutb al-dawla wa nasr al-milla, ornate style, with elegant calligraphy, citing an amir, but the name still undeciphered, both on this example and the 2 pieces on Zeno, lovely VF, RRR





QARAKHANID: al- Husayn b. Mansur, 1015-1016, AE fals 440 (1.89g), Bukhara, AH403, A-3317E, Kochnev-305b, Zeno-102442, \$120 - 150 with the snow leopard in the obverse field, F-VF, RR

The reverse margin legend is "al-amir al-jalal yanghân-tegin al-mansur (...)", which is part of the titulature of al-Husayn b. Mansur.





441 QARAKHANID: 'Ali b. al-Hasan, 1020-1025, AE fals (3.27g), Khutlugh Urdu, AH425, A-3348, cf. Zeno-97581, citing the ruler with complex titulature al-khan gutb al-dawla wa nasr al-milla tabghaj bughra qara khaqan, decent strike, choice VF, RRR







442. QARAKHANID: Yusuf b. Harun, 1005-1032, AR dirham (3.47g), Kashghar, AH420, A-3355, citing the ruler as malik al-mashriq, "king of the east," after his occupation of Khotan in AH418, appears unpublished, not in Kochnev and not on Zeno, F-VF, RRR \$150 - 200





QARAKHANID: Burhan al-Dawla Ayyub, 1062, Bl dirham 443 (3.47g), Quz Urdu, AH454, A-3383A, Kochnev-1320, with the additional title nasir amir al-mu'minin, VF, RRR \$130 - 170





QARAKHANID: Ibrahim b. Husayn, 1178-1203, AV dinar (3.07g), 444 MM, AH58x, A-3405, muling of two reverses, thus citing only the Abbasid caliph and without the name of Ibrahim, bent and some \$190 - 210





445. QARAKHANID: Ibrahim b. Nasr, as independent ruler, 1040-1068, BI dirham (4.04g), Akhsikath, AH455, A-3328, Kochnev-896 (listed only at possible mint for this type), ruler cited as Tabghaj Khan Ibrahim, with the title malik al-mashriq wa'l-sin, "king of the East and China", after his conquest of Khotan in AH453, date weak but very likely, mint name sufficiently clear, F-VF, RRR \$100 - 150





446. QARAKHANID: Anonymous, 11th century, lead religious talisman (5.19g), fanciful bird, border of ornate pellets around // Arabic legends, blank margin, minor defect in the reverse field, appears to be unpublished, VF-EF, RRR

447. QARAKHANID: LOT of 38 Qarakhanid and 6 Tahirid copper coins. Qarakhanid: the group included the mints of Banakath, Bukhara, Ferghana, Ilaq, Kharashkath, Khujanda, Kushani, Nawkath, Samarqand, al-Shash, and Usrushana, many with legible dates, all in envelopes with the full or partial identification by the consignor, average F-VF condition, many with porosity or other small defects; Tahirid: all type A-1395 of Tahir b. Muhammad II, al-Shash mint, average VG condition, all without clear mint & date; retail value \$1300, lot of 44 pieces

QARAKHANID: LOT of 14 silver dirhams (some actually billon) 449. from the united period (AH 382-433), by Checklist numbers: A-3304: Isbijab AH400 (2 pcs) and 401, Quz Urdu 401, 402, 403 (2); A-3307, al-Shash 414, Taraz 400 and 401 (2); **A-3333**: al-Shash 400; **A-3354**: Nawkath 409; and **A-3361**: al-Shash 421; all at least VF condition, but most with minor defects (e.g., weak areas, stains, light adhesions), some quite attractive; retail value \$900, lot of 14 pieces, ex Jim Farr Collection

QARAKHANID: LOT of 50 Qarakhanid copper dirhams of the late 450 period, including the mints of Banakath, Kasan, Kashghar (common type of Mas'ud al-Khwarizmi), Samarqand, and Uzkand, all in envelopes, most with the full or partial identification supplied by the consignor; average VG to Fine condition, many with porosity, weakness, or other small defects; retail value \$850, lot of 50 pieces \$350 - 500 451. 452 QARAKHANID: LOT of 2 silver and 10 billon coins, all dirhams: Silver: Isbijab, AH400 (VF, much adhesions), and Nawkath (aka Tunkath) 408 (VF, porous surfaces); and Billon: mostly issues of Ibrahim from the AH 440s and 450s, some with fragments of the mint/date formula, all unidentified (average Good to VG condition); retail value \$350, lot of 12 pieces



453. BUWAYHID: Qiwam al-Dawla, 1012-1028, AR dirham (3.84g), al-Sirjân, AH415, A-1583, Treadwell—, with his full titulature sanad al-din qiwam al-dawla wa sharaf al-milla wa zayn al-umma abu'l-fawaris, citing the chief Buwayhid ruler Sultan al-Dawla, \$200 - 300 slight central weakness, probably unique, VF, RRR

This piece was originally offered in Islamic Coin Auction 27, Lot 687.





BUWAYHID: Fulad Sutûn, 2nd reign, 1055-1061, AR dirham 454 (3.67g), Shiraz, AH451, A-1585F, Treadwell-, ruler cited as shahanshah abu mansur, also citing the Great Seljuq Tughril Beg as overlord and the caliph al-Qa'im, triskeles in reverse margin, both sides within ornate octagram, some light adhesions near the rim, VF, RRR

Only one coin of Fulad Sutun is on CoinArchives, also Shiraz 451, but totally different style. Treadwell cites dirhams of Fulad's first reign (Shiraz AH440), but none for his second reign, the last reign of the Buwayhids.

GHAZNAVID: Mahmud, 999-1030, AV dinar (3.21g), Nishapur, 457. AH394, A-1606, yamini below obverse field, star below the reverse field, creased, VF-EF, ex Dabestani Collection \$180 - 220





GHAZNAVID: Mas'ud I, 1030-1041, BI dirham (5.32g), Hamadan, 458 AH423, A-1621J, citing the Ghaznavid ruler only as Nasir Din Allah Abu Sa'id, without any subordinate ruler, some weakness, VF. RRR

There are no examples of this type on either Zeno or CoinArchives (the only other example seems to be Isbahan 42x at Tübingen); the type is well-known for gold dinars dated 423-427 (type A-1618J).





459. GHAZNAVID: Ibrahim, 1059-1099, AV dinar (4.20g) (Ghazna), DM, A-1637, pale gold, type struck AH480-485, VF, ex Dabestani Collection \$100 - 150





460. GHAZNAVID: Ibrahim, 1059-1099, AV dinar (4.39g), Ghazna, AH491, A-1637.3, type dated AH491, with the additional title Shahanshah, citing the caliph al-Mustazhir (AH487-512), about 35% flat, and perhaps as a result of the flat area; the date, which is in the struck area, is bolder than any other AH491 example we \$160 - 200 have seen, with the mint also legible, EF





461. GHAZNAVID: Ibrahim, 1059-1099, AV dinar (4.43g) (Ghazna), AH491, A-1637.3, with the additional title Shahanshah, citing the caliph al-Mustazhir (AH487-512), date sufficiently clear, \$160 - 200







GHAZNAVID: Mas'ud III, 1099-1115, AV dinar (7.54g), Ghazna, 462 AH492, A-1647, with titles sanâ al-milla malik al-islam zahir al-imam, mint & date sufficiently clear, some weakness, remarkably heavy, EF \$220 - 280





463. **GHAZNAVID: Mas'ud III**, 1099-1115, AV dinar (6.64g), Ghazna, AH(4)92, A-1647, with titles *sanâ al-milla malik al-islam zahir al-imam,* date weak but certain, mint very clear, some weakness, mainly towards the edge, heavy, EF \$180 - 220





464. **GHAZNAVID: Mas'ud III**, 1099-1115, AV dinar (3.92g) (Ghazna), AH(4)92, A-1647, with titles *sanâ al-milla malik al-islam zahir al-imam,* date very clear, usual weakness around the edge, EF \$170 - 200





465. **GHAZNAVID: Mas'ud III**, 1099-1115, AV dinar (4.58g), Ghazna, AH(4)92, A-1647, with titles *sanâ al-milla malik al-islam zahir al-imam,* date very clear, mint name fully legible, EF \$170 - 200





466. GHAZNAVID: Mas'ud III, 1099-1115, AV dinar (6.01g) (Ghazna), AH(4)9(2), A-1647, with titles sanâ al-milla malik al-islam zahir al-imam and majd al-ayyâm, field legends very clear, EF \$170 - 200





467. **GHAZNAVID: Mas'ud III**, 1099-1115, AV dinar (4.85g), Ghazna, AH(492), A-1647, with titles *sanâ al-milla malik al-islam zahir al-imam*, very clear mint name, EF \$170 - 200

473. **GREAT SELJUQ: Tughril Beg**, 1038-1063, AV dinar (4.27g), Aydhaj, AH447, A-1665, very rare mint, VF, **RR** \$400 - 500

Aydhaj was the medieval capital of Greater Loristan, now the small city of Izeh in the northeast corner of Khuzestan province in Iran.





474. **GREAT SELJUQ: Alp Arslan**, 1058-1063, AV dinar, pale gold (4.45g), Marw, AH462, A-1671, clear mint & date, creased, VF \$140 - 170





475. **GREAT SELJUQ: Malikshah I**, 1072-1092, AV dinar, pale gold (4.62g), MM, DM, A-1675, citing the caliph al-Muqtafi, VF \$130 - 160



- 476. **GREAT SELJUQ: Sanjar**, 1118-1157, AV dinar (3.25g) (Nishapur), AH513, A-1686, fine gold, mint almost certainly Nishapur, by style; citing the caliph al-Mustarshid, VF \$150 200
- 477. GREAT SELJUQ: LOT of 7 pieces in various metals: A-1665, fine AV dinar, Nishapur AH445 (2.95g, F-VF); A-1666, BI dirham, style of Nishapur (VF); A-1668, BI dirham, style of Balkh (Fine, porous surfaces); A-1675, pale AV dinar, style of Marw or Sarakhs, AH48x (VF); A-B1688, AE fals, Bukhara mint, date off as usual, flower reverse (2, both Fine); and A-B1707, fine AV dinar of Inanj Beg, Hamadan type (3.26g, VF, some weakness); retail value \$650, lot of 7 pieces, ex Jim Farr Collection \$400 450

479. **SELJUQ OF WESTERN IRAN: Mahmud II**, 1118-1131, AV dinar (3.14g), Tustar, AH524, A-1688, very rare mint for the Seljuqs, citing the Great Seljuq Sanjar as overlord, nice strike for this ruler, VF, **RRR** \$300 - 400

Only 3 Seljuq dinars of Mahmud struck at Tustar are listed on CoinArchives, two dated 512, one dated 519, all without citing Sanjar.



- 480. **AMIR OF NISHAPUR: Toghanshah**, 1172-1185 AH, AV dinar (2.24g), MM, AH5xx, A-1708.2, citing the caliph al-Nasir and presumably also his son Sanjar as heir (off flan), struck at Nishapur, VF, **R**, ex Jim Farr Collection \$120 160
- 481. KHWARIZMSHAH: Muhammad, 1200-1220, LOT of 8 silver and 5 copper, Silver: A-1715, Ghazna (2, including one clearly dated AH617); A-1716, Farwan (1); 1719, assigned to Balkh (2), A-1720, Ghazna (1), A-1720A, ½ dirham, Ghazna (1), and A-1721, NM (1); and Copper: A-1722, broad dirham of Samarqand, jamshahri (dated 610), and zafari (dated 613); A-A1724, Tirmidh (2); and A-1731.2, jital of Kurzuwan (1); mostly F-VF condition, excellent general collection of 'Ala al-Din Muhammad's standard coinage; retail value \$450, lot of 13 pieces \$200 260
- 482. 488. ARTUQIDS OF AMID & KAYFA: Fakhr al-Din Qara Arslan, 1144-1174, AE dirham (7.99g), NM, AH562, A-1820.7, SS-7, long-haired male bust facing, wearing elaborate vest, choice VF, R \$120 - 160

The Third Anglo-Mysore War (1789-1792) ended in defeat for Tipu Sultan. After about two weeks of siege at Srirangapatna, Tipu opened negotiations for terms of surrender. In the ensuing treaty, he was forced to cede half his territories to the allies, and deliver two of his sons as hostages until he paid in full three crores and thirty lakhs rupees fixed as war indemnity to the British for the campaign against him. He paid the amount in two installments and got back his sons from Madras.
