The name Phanes () appears on a number of electrum coins of Ephesos struck during the late 7th century BC, and they are the earliest known inscribed coins of antiquity. The full stater bears the phrase "I am the badge of Phanes", and the trite (1/3 stater) simply bears the name Phanes; the other smaller denominations are anepigraphic, but all display the stag of Artemis. It is uncertain whether Phanes refers to the moneyer or a deity.

The figure on the obverse is commonly identified as Vercingetorix, the king of the Arverni who united Gallic tribes against the Roman forces and was famously defeated at the Battle of Alesia by Julius Caesar, though this identification is doubtful.

Julia Paula was married to the new emperor Elagabalus in early 219. Their marriage was short-lived, however, as Elagabalus divorced her in 220 in order to marry the Vestal Virgin Aquilia Severa.
