The reign of Ptolemy VI began at six years old after the death of his father. The kingdom was governed by regents and his mother due to his young age. His sister-wife Cleopatra II and younger brother Ptolemy VIII ruled alongside him for some time as well, the latter of whom was at odds with Ptolemy VI for control of the Kingdom. This time also saw the Ptolemaic Kingdom at war against the Seleucid Empire. Some years after the end of the Sixth Syrian War (170-168 BC) Ptolemy VI was expelled from Egypt, but would return one year later in 163 BC after the people of Alexandria turned against Ptolemy VIII who had been in power during his absence.

An extremely rare mint for Ptolemaic gold coins, Svoronos knew of only regnal year 14 for Kition from this series, with only one other example dated year 23 (CNG Mail Bid Sale 61, Lot 873, 2002) ever appearing in auctions to our knowledge.



Alimentary grants (alimenta) were a form of state support for citizen children promulgated by Nerva and expanded under Trajan. Unlike previous grain doles, which were privately funded and limited to the capital, the new initiative represents a serious attempt at state-funded subsidy at regular intervals for children all across Italy. In one locality, records indicate that boys received 16 sestertii per month, whereas girls received 12 sestertii. Trajan must have taken pride in the alimenta that coins were issued in gold, silver and bronze to commemorate his achievement. This program continued under his successor and lasted into the mid-3rd century.

Having thrown their support behind the Gordians' failed revolt, the senators elected two of their own, Pupienus and Balbinus, to the throne in a bid to save themselves. News soon came of Maximinus' death at the hands of a group of disaffected soldiers following his unsuccessful siege of Aquileia, and Pupienus returned to Rome to celebrate a triumph with Balbinus. However, their joint reign was immediately marred by their unpopularity, as well as their mutual distrust. The two men ruled for just 99 days before they were brutally murdered by members of the Praetorian Guard.

Around 351 BC Artaxerxes launched a campaign to recover Egypt which had revolted under his father. The campaign eventually failed. Not long after that defeat Anatolia, Cyprus and Phoenicia declared their independence from Persian rule. In 343 BC Artaxerxes tasked Carian prince Idrieus with suppressing the rebellion in Cyprus. Idrieus succeded with assitance from 8000 Greek mercenaries as well as forty triremes commanced by Phocion the Athenaian and Evagoras, son of the elder Cypriot monarch Evagoras.

There are two distinct varieties assigned to the mint of GW: (1) fine style, such as this piece and Sunrise-1005; and (2) primitive style, GW coarsely engraved, and overall less carefully engraved (cf. Lot 38 sold in our Auction 15). The fine style continues the style of all earlier Sasanian kings, and the assignment to the city of Gorgan (Jurjan, now Gonbad-e Kavus) is now universally accepted. The primitive style mint has been considered Qumm, as is GW on all the Arab-Sasanian drachms, which were first struck about 25 years after Queen Boran.

The consignor suggested a "strange issue of Jayy mint", but the style is wrong for Jayy. Thus a northeastern mint seems much more likely than a central Iranian location. The Balkh 82 issue also has a rather crudely engraved mint some but is at tilatically user as in the seems but is at tilatically user as in the seems of mint name, but is stylistically very similar to this piece. It seem possible that the engraved may have copied a Jayy dirham and was unsure how to engrave the mint name, which could be interpreted as either "jayy" or "balkh".
