19	<b>UPDATE</b> – We had this graded after the auction went to print. It is NGC Choice VF, Strike 5/5, Surface 4/5
20	<b>UPDATE</b> – We had this graded after the auction went to print. It is NGC Mint State, Strike 4/5, Surface 5/5
57	<b>UPDATE</b> – We had this graded after the auction went to print. It is NGC Choice AU, Strike 5/5, Surface 4/5
101	<b>UPDATE</b> – We had this graded after the auction went to print. It is NGC XF, Strike 3/5, Surface 5/5 – Additionally, it was attributed by NGC with an "uncertain date after 19 BC". In our opinion, the date on the reverse can be established as Civil Year 154 (expressed as PΔ in Greek numerals) with a high degree of certainty. The letters P (100), situated right above the end of the club, and Δ (4), just before the eagle, are clear and require no further explanation. The middle digit is rendered as an indistinct vertical stroke, though its identity can be elucidated by die comparisons. The obverse die is the same as DCA Tyre-552, which is clearly dated 154 though with a different reverse die. It is also identical to the obverse of DCA Tyre-683, an example with a blundered date from the Isfiya Hoard, which was discovered on Mount Carmel in 1960 and contained some 3400 Tyrian shekels among other coins. Cohen (p.341) notes that these crudely engraved shekels of this hoard frequently have M (40) or N (50) in their date. Indeed, a survey of the examples pictured in DCA Tyre finds a number of shekels featuring a Melkart with unusually crude, low-relief facial features (e.g. a lidless dot-like eye, a floating nose) around the decade of CY 150's but in no other periods. These characteristics thus squarely place this coin in this decade and establishes its precise date.

293	<b>ADDITIONAL INFORMATION</b> – The bold clear date AH 1026 on the reverse, together with the mint name Amid, proves that it must be an issue of Mustafa I, 1st reign, and very rare. The other side is clearly in the name of the previous sultan Ahmed b. Mehmet (1012-1026), so it is clear that the Amid mint was using an obsolete obverse die for this coin, likely because they were not about to discard a working die, or perhaps they simply forgot to check the obverse die. All proper gold and silver from the mint of Amid (modern Diyarbakir) are always dated 1012 (occasionally 1013 and even 1014), but never 1026.

1450	<b>UPDATED DESCRIPTION</b> – AFGHANISTAN: Amanullah, 1919-1929, AV 60 rupee (1 1/2 amani) (6.98g), AH1337 (1918), KM-Unlisted, H-22A, PCGS graded Specimen 61, ex Hakim Hamidi Collection.  An extremely rare gold pattern and we have not found any records of another example of this rare type ever having been offered in public auction.  NOTE: In the printed catalog we incorrectly called this an issue of Habibullah (1901-1919) because the coin dates to 1918, but it is a pattern in the name of the next ruler Amanullah (1919-1929). We also did not mention that the denomination is written as 60 rupee.

We also incorrectly called it a 1 sapeque in our printed catalog. There is a clear "value 2" on the reverse.
3837	<b>UPDATED DESCRIPTION</b> – JAPAN: Showa + Heisei eras, LOT of 5 proof coins, including 1, 10, 50, 100 yen dated Heisei year 28 (2016) and a 5 yen dated Showa year 63 (1988); all graded in PR-70DCAM by PCGS, a high quality lot of proofs!! set of 5 coins  <b>NOTE:</b> We had originally called this a 5-coin set all dated Heisei 28 in the printed catalog.
